Friday's Coronavirus Update

The number of coronavirus cases in Rhea County has jumped to 188. Dr. Craig Swafford, a surgeon at Rhea County Medical Center, says the spike in cases is due to a large number of migrant workers who tested positive for the virus at a farm. McMinn County's cases stand at 124, down 1 from Wednesday. 90 patients in McMinn have recovered. There have been 12 deaths. Tennessee now has 18,961 cases and there have been 313 deaths.

TODAY IN HISTORY - MAY 22nd

1813 - German composer Richard Wagner was born. He wrote the Processional Wedding March (better known as "Here Comes the Bride").

1859 - Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, creater of Sherlock Holmes, was born.

1861 - In what is generally regarded as the first Union combat fatality of the Civil War, Pvt. Thornsbury Bailey Brown was shot and killed by a Confederate soldier at Fetterman Bridge in present-day West Virginia.

1907 - Actor Sir Laurence Olivier was born.

1939 - The foreign ministers of Germany and Italy signed a "Pact of Steel" committing the two countries to a military alliance.

1960 - An earthquake of magnitude 9.5, the strongest ever measured, struck southern Chile, claiming some 1,655 lives. **1972** – President Richard Nixon was the first American President to visit Moscow on this date.

1981 - "Yorkshire Ripper" Peter Sutcliffe was convicted in London of murdering 13 women and was sentenced to life in prison.

1992 - Johnny Carson hosted NBCs "Tonight Show" for the last time after nearly 30 years on the job.

1998 - A federal judge ruled that Secret Service agents could be compelled to testify before the grand jury in the Monica Lewinsky investigation. Voters in Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland turned out to cast ballots giving resounding approval to a Northern Ireland peace accord.
