Covid-19 Virus Update

Tennessee's coronavirus cases continue to rise. As of Tuesday afternoon, there have been 20,965 cases statewide, with 343 deaths. McMinn County's total was unchanged at 135. Ninety-four of the patients have recovered and there have been 14 deaths. Meigs County's totals are unchanged, with 25 cases and 20 recovered. Rhea County reports 197 cases and 12 have recovered.

✓ Athens Parks Director Austin Fesmire says a decision will be made on June 1st on whether the Athens 4th of July Fireworks Show will take place at Athens Regional Park this year. Fesmire also says the City of Athens is now abiding by Governor Bill Lee's decision to allow people to gather in the parks and elsewhere in groups of up to 50 as long as they practice social distancing. He says the problem with reopening the Splash Pad and Ingleside Pool is how to deal with big crowds of people. He says a decision will be made soon about the Splash Pad and the pool.

✓ The dropbox at the E.G. Fisher Public Library is now open for returning checked-out items. The library also will begin offering contactless curbside service on June 2nd. The interior of the library will remain closed. Curbside pick-up will be available Tuesdays and Thursdays between 12 noon and 4 p.m. Requests must be made no later than 3 p.m. the day prior to pick-up.
