- ♦ The Tennessee Valley Authority shattered a new record on Wednesday for power demand across the state. Wednesday morning's preliminary peak power demand was 34,526 megawatts at a system average temperature of 4 degrees. That sets an all-time TVA record. The previous record was 33,482 megawatts during a strong heat wave in August 2007. Here's the good news....temperatures should be rising above freezing.
- the good news....temperatures should be rising above freezing. ◆Tennessee Department of Treasury, Unclaimed Property Division returned \$68.7 million of cash property to the rightful owners or their heirs, local governments, and reciprocal states during fiscal year 2023. It's the most money the Division has ever returned in a single fiscal year. Unclaimed property is money that has been turned over to the State by businesses and organizations unable to locate the rightful owners, such as utility refunds, uncashed paychecks, credit balances for overpayments, rental deposit refunds, gift certificates, securities, and abandoned bank accounts. The Unclaimed Property program is a consumer protection program of the Department of Treasury that works to reunite missing money with its rightful owner. There is no time limit on claiming the property, and there is never a fee to claim it in Tennessee. If you are ever contacted about unclaimed property in Tennessee and would like to check the validity, go to ClaimItTN.gov

Peoples Bank President Appointed To ABA Council

Jeremy Callais (See Photo below) has been appointed chair of the American Bankers Association's Community Bankers Council for the 2023-2024 membership year. He previously served on the Council's Administrative Committee. Callais is the president of Peoples Bank of East Tennessee, a \$360 million asset bank based in Tennessee and established in 1997. Peoples Bank of East Tennessee prides itself on providing every customer in the community with the latest technology and products, including free online banking, ATM, debit and credit services, and flexible operating hours. Callais, who chaired the ABA Community Bankers Council meeting November 13-15, said the bankers discussed public policy, operations, and business issues that might impact the nation's hometown banks and their communities. Bankers discussed legislative priorities, including



the ACRE Act, Credit Card Competition Act, and SAFER Banking Act; regulatory issues, including Section 1033 of the Dodd-Frank Act; debit card interchange fees; and the Administration's executive order on artificial intelligence. Council members also had a chance to share ways high-interest rates have affected the banking industry and exchange ideas on deposit generation, loan growth, talent attraction and retention, and other business and operational best practices. Before his time at Peoples Bank of East Tennessee, Callais was President of a community bank in South Louisiana, where he also held positions of CFO and COO. He has also worked in a conversion training role for a core data processor. The role of ABA's Community Bankers Council is to increase community banker involvement in ABA by identifying and responding to community bank priorities, representing community banking in ABA's government relations policy-making process, developing a broad range of association products and services to make community banks more competitive, and other areas. Callais holds a master's degree in education and attended both ABA's National Compliance School and Stonier School of Banking. He currently resides in East Tennessee. Tennessee Unemployment

Unemployment in Tennessee held steady during the final month of 2023. Newly released data from the Department of Labor and Workforce Development showed the rate did not change between November and December at 3.5%. The seasonally adjusted rate of 3.5% for December 2023 also mirrored the rate from December one year ago. In a month-to-month comparison, Tennessee employers added 1,400 new nonfarm jobs across the state. The health care and social assistance sector saw the most growth in December. The construction sector recorded the next largest number of new jobs, followed by the accommodation and food services sector. Over the last year, the number of new nonfarm jobs grew by 22,700 across Tennessee. The health care and social assistance sector accounted for the largest percentage of new jobs between 2022 and 2023. The professional, scientific, and technical services sector added the second-largest number of jobs during the year, followed by the accommodation and food services sector.
