Fleischmann, EPB, ORNL Announce Plans

U.S. Representative Chuck Fleischmann, Chairman of the Energy and Water Subcommittee of Appropriations, hosted recently appointed Oak Ridge National Lab (ORNL) Director Dr. Stephen K. Streiffer and EPB to announce the new Collaborative for Energy Resilience and Quantum Science (CERQS). The new joint research effort builds on over \$180 million in joint research between EPB and ORNL through the Chattanooga-Oak Ridge partnership created by Rep. Fleischmann. CERQS will focus on utilizing Chattanooga's highly advanced energy and communications infrastruc-ture to develop technologies and best practices for enhancing the resilience and security of America's power grid while accelerating the commercialization of quantum technologies to power the economy into the future. "Since I came to Congress, one of my highest priorities has been creating and strengthening the Chattanooga-Oak Ridge Partnership that's changed East Tennessee and the entire Southeastern region of our great nation. Because of the increased collaboration between outstanding entities in Chattanooga, such as EPB, and organizations in Oak Ridge, like ORNL, major advancements are taking place in science, technology, research – generating hundreds of millions of dollars in economic impact and making Tennessee and the entire Southeastern United States the world leader in new and emerging technologies and industries," said Rep. Fleischmann. To date, EPB and ORNL have collaborated on nearly 30 funded projects. These efforts encompass a wide range of research, including the development of advanced energy models to optimize power distribution, the utilization of predictive algorithms to identify likely energy equipment failures so they can be addressed before customers lose power, and the deployment of dynamic micro-grids that can be rapidly scaled to meet changing energy needs as power supplied by solar and other renewable energy. gy resources changes unpredictably throughout the day.
