State News

◆A small group of Pro-Palestinian Protesters marched along the streets near Nashville's Centennial Park Sunday. The latest protest coincides with new proposed legislation in the Tennessee General Assembly. Three bills are under consideration: HJR 688, SJR 805, and SJR 870, show their full support for Israel and condemn the attacks by the terrorist group Hamas in early October. A Rabbi with the Jewish Federation of Nashville said that "Knowing we have the backing of our state leadership in this way, is incredibly humbling and appreciated by us in the Jewish community". The Tennessee General Assembly shows two bills were "passed on second consideration" and referred to the Senate Finance committee. The other has not yet moved forward. Newschannel5.com

The National Park Service is preparing to burn 1000 acres of fields in Cades Cove in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park by the end of March. NPS said that burn operations depend on weather conditions. Crews are monitoring conditions including vegetation, soil moisture, wind speed and direction, temperature and relative humidity to ensure that the burn can be conducted safely. The loop road and historic structures will remain open during the burns, however, the road to the Primitive Baptist Church will be closed. Visitors should also expect delays during burn opera-tions. People are also asked to reduce speed in work zones, and to roll up their windows and turn on their headlights if smoke is present. WATE.com

Polk County Texting / Home Detention

-The Polk County 911 Emergency Communication District now offers Texting to 911. This will allow smart phone users to text 911 if they cannot make a voice call. When texting to 911, type "911" in the "To" field. Officials advise making the message brief and concise. It should include the location of the emergency and the type of help needed. The McMinn County 911 center began accepting texts late last year.

-A new proposed bill would allow some older Tennessee inmates to spend the remainder of their sentence at home. The bill would require the Tennessee Department of Correction to create a five-year pilot program to release elderly inmates who have served at least 65% of their sentence to home detention. They define an elderly inmate as a person who is 60 years of age or older. Inmates must also not be serving a sentence for a violent sexual offense or more than one conviction of first-degree murder, or facilitation of first-degree murder, and are not serving a sentence of imprisonment for life without parole.
