Black History Month

February is Black History Month. Black History Month is an annual observance that originated in the United States. It has received official recognition from governments in the United States and Canada and has been observed in Ireland and the United Kingdom. Carter G. Woodson was dedicated to celebrating the historic contributions of Black people which led to the establishment of Black History Month. Negro History Week was celebrated for the first time the week of February 7, 1926. Woodson chose February because President Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass had birthdays in February; Lincoln on Feb. 12, and Douglass, a former slave, on Feb. 14. Both played a prominent role in shaping black history. The week-long event officially became Black History Month in 1976 when President Gerald R. Ford extended the recognition to honor Black Americans. Black History Month was created to focus attention of African Americans contributions to the United States. It honors all Black people from all periods of U.S. history, beginning with the enslaved people first brought over from Africa in the early 17th century to African Americans living in the United States
