Voting Deadlines

The Tennessee Secretary of State's office and McMinn County Administrator of Elections, TeAnna McKinney, reminds all McMinn County voters that Tuesday, Feb. 27 is the final day to cast a ballot during the early voting period for the March 5th Presidential Preference Primary and County Primaries. "Early voting concludes on Feb. 27, but there is still time for all registered McMinn County voters to cast their ballots ahead of Super Tuesday," said Administrator of Elections, TeAnna McKinney. The ballot for the March 5 Presidential Preference Primary was certified and set in December of 2023 so some candidates who have suspended their presidential campaign will still appear on the ballot. Voters will not only be selecting their preferred presidential candidate, but they will also be selecting delegates if voting in the Republican Primary, and Offices for District Attorney 10th Judicial District, Property Assessor, McMinn County School Board, Districts 1-5, Constable Districts 2 & 4, Etowah City School Board. "If you are a registered Tennessee voter and you have not yet cast your ballot during the early voting period, now is the time," said Secretary of State Tre Hargett. "Early voting provides a safe, secure process for registered voters to let their voices be heard before Election Day." Tn State Senate Advances Proposals

Last week, the Senate advanced proposals aimed at amending the Tennessee Constitution. One bill Senator Adam Lowe is sponsoring will empower parents to make the best educational decisions for their child. On Wednesday, the Senate Education Committee advanced legislation to empower parents to have the final say over education decisions for their child. <u>Senate Bill 1688</u> allows parents and guardians to hold back their child from the next grade without the approval of the school board if their child has a learning or behavioral delay. The bill advances to the Senate floor for final consideration.
