Near Record-Low Unemployment

In February, Tennessee's unemployment rate decreased to 3.3%, nearing its record low. This was a decrease of 0.2%from January's revised rate. The state's all-time low seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is 3.1% which was recorded during April, May, and June in 2023. Total nonfarm employment increased by 10,100 jobs, with education and health services leading the gains. The professional and business services sector added the next largest number of jobs, followed by the government sector. Over the past year, Tennessee added 6,700 new nonfarm jobs, with growth in various sectors. Nationally, unemployment rose to 3.9% in February. Tennessee offers reemployment services through Jobs4TN.gov, which currently lists over open positions across 240,000 the state, TNWorkReady.com can also help find employment and training opportunities or to find a nearby American Job Center or Adult Education program. County-specific unemployment data will be released on March 28, 2024.


Lee Bans Support Animals in Restaurants

Governor Bill Lee has officially signed House Bill • Cambria Baptist Church presents "HE IS ALIVE !!!", their 1635, ushering in a new regulation that prohibits the presence of emotional support animals in restaurants and hotels statewide. This measure, an extension of existing legislation, now explicitly bans animals other than trained service dogs, police K-9 units, and fish from these establishments. Prior to this bill, Tennessee law had already barred most dogs from entering food-serving establishments. However, the enactment of House Bill 1635 serves to reinforce this restriction by specifically targeting emotional support animals, including cats, and extending the prohibition beyond dogs.
