Protecting Children From Social Media Act

Known as the Protecting Children from Social Media Act, which mandates social media companies to authenticate the age of their users and require minors to obtain parental approval. According to the law, individuals under 18 must have parental or guardian consent to register for a social media profile. For existing accounts held by minors, companies must verify parental consent, failing which access will be denied. Furthermore, platforms must offer parents means to monitor these accounts. Non-compliance exposes companies to potential lawsuits by the Tennessee attorney general.

Real ID Deadline Approaching

The Real ID Act was passed by Congress in 2005 with the primary objective, as highlighted by the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security, being the prevention of identity theft. This legislation adds an additional layer of security to ensure uniformity in ID issuance procedures across all states. As the deadline approaches, Tennessee residents must obtain a Real ID, which necessitates presenting proof of citizenship (such as an unexpired passport or birth certificate), along with their social security number and two forms of Tennessee residency proof. The Real ID is mandatory for passing TSA security, accessing federal buildings, and other identification purposes. However, alternative documents like a valid passport are still acceptable for travel and federal building entry. The deadline for obtaining a Real ID is May 7th, 2025.
