Household Hazardous Waste Mobile Collection Service



The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) is hosting a mobile household hazardous waste collection service in Humphreys, Meigs, and Robertson counties on Saturday, May 11. Tennesseans are urged to bring items

like cleaning fluids, pesticides, and swimming pool chemicals to designated drop-off points. You do not need to live inside those counties to participate. The drop-off location in Meigs County is at Decatur Farmers Market on Hwy. 58, Decatur, from 8 am - 1 pm. The contact is Eddie Jewell at (423) 334-5850. Since its start in 1993, the program has seen over 373,000 households dispose of more than 24 million pounds of hazardous material across over 1,500 collection events. Household hazardous waste, such as cleaning fluids and pesticides, poses risks due to its flammability, toxicity, reactivity, or corrosiveness. Items like mercury thermometers, fluorescent lamps, lithium batteries, and used needles should also be disposed of properly. Certain materials like ammunition, explosives, and electronics are not accepted. The service is free, with no appointment necessary. Story Continued on Page 3.

Household Hazardous Waste Mobile Collection Service

From page 1......There's a fee for disposing of Very Small Quantity Generator Waste from non-household sources, like businesses or schools. Appointments are required for this, and individuals can call (615) 643-3170 for pricing and scheduling. Additionally, communities often offer collection services for batteries, oil, paint, antifreeze, and electronic scrap, known as BOPAE. These materials, though less hazardous, aren't suitable for household hazardous waste events. Residents are advised to contact their local solid waste department for BOPAE collection sites.

When transporting materials, it's essential to use sturdy containers lined with newspaper or plastic to prevent spills and contamination. Keep hazardous items away from children and pets during transportation.
