

### **TBI Investigation in Knox County**

TBI agents are investigating an officer-involved shooting in Knox County, prompted by a report of a man threatening self-harm at Clayton Park. Deputies from the Knox County Sheriff's Office encountered the armed man around 5:00 p.m., resulting in shots fired and the man being hospitalized. No deputies were harmed. TBI agents are working to independently determine the series of events leading to the shooting, including collecting evidence and conducting interviews. Throughout the process, investigative findings will be shared with the District Attorney General for her further review and consideration. The TBI acts solely as fact-finders in its cases and does not determine whether the actions of an officer were justified in these types of matters. That decision rests with the District Attorney General requesting TBI's involvement. Officer identities are not disclosed by the TBI. # Three People Indicted In Johnson City Man's Death

Three individuals have been indicted in connection with the overdose death of Alexander Jordan Payne, who was found dead in his home in Johnson City due to fentanyl and cocaine intoxication. The investigation, conducted by the Johnson City Police Department and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation - Drug Related Death Task Force, identified Samantha Robinson, Lavonti Montego Jeter, and Macala Lynn Wheeler as involved in distributing the drugs that led to Payne's death. On May 1st, the Washington County Grand Jury returned indictments charging Robinson, Jeter, and Wheeler each with one count of Second Degree Murder, one count of Sale of Fentanyl, and one count of Conspiracy to Sell/Deliver Fentanyl. All three were arrested and booked into the Washington County Jail on a \$50,000 bond. The investigation was part of the efforts of the TBI Upper East Drug Related Death Task Force, a collaboration with various law enforcement agencies and drug awareness/rehabilitation organizations, aimed at prosecuting drug sources and trafficking organizations to prevent drug-related deaths.

## **Ingleside Pool Opening Soon**

The City of Athens Parks and Recreation Department announces the Ingleside Pool will open on Friday, May 24<sup>th</sup> 2024. The hours of operation are Monday-Saturday 11:00am-2:00pm and 3:00-5:00pm. There is an hour break for facility maintenance/staff change between 2:00pm and 3:00pm. Sunday hours are 2:00pm-5:00pm.

Beginning on opening day, the entry fees will be as follows: Child/Senior daily passes \$4.00,
Adult daily passes \$5.00,
7-use passes \$30.00,
Child/Senior season passes \$80.00,
Adult season passes \$90.00,

Family season passes will \$200.00.

Rates for renting the pool for parties will be \$40 per hour. Beginning with the 2024 season, all pool patrons will receive a wristband that allows them to come and go throughout the pool's operating hours that day. They will not have to pay a second time after the staff change at 2:00pm. 7-day and season passes can be purchased online by visiting <a href="www.athenstn.gov">www.athenstn.gov</a>, over the phone by calling the Parks and Recreation office at 423-744-2704, or in person at 815 N.
