Marie Browning Lambert, 94, of Etowah, passed away Sunday, May 19, at Etowah Health Care Center. She was born in Rock, West Virginia on Browning Lambert Mountain. She was a longtime resident of Etowah. Her college years began at Concord University in Athens, West Virginia where she earned her teacher's certificate. When she and her husband moved to TN, she began classes at the University of TN in Knoxville and at Tennessee Wesleyan College. She received her Master's degree in Education and Administration from the University of TN at Chattanooga. She was an elementary school teacher and principal in West Virginia, Virginia and Tennessee. She retired from the Etowah City School System. She was a longtime member of the First Presbyterian Church where she served as Chairman of the Board of the Christian Children's Center. She was very active in the Presbyterian Women Bible Study group. She served on the Board of Directors of the Area-wide Cancer Support Group from it's beginning in 2001 and as a Director on the Board of the Etowah Area Senior Citizens. Funeral service will be held at 7:00 p.m., Thursday, May 23, 2024 in the chapel of Bordwine Funeral Home. The family will receive friends from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m., Thursday prior to the service. Family and friends will assemble at Green Hill Cemetery, Friday, May 24th for the 11:00 a.m. committal service. Bordwine Funeral Home of Etowah is in charge of arrangements.

TODAY IN HISTORY - MAY 22

1861 - In what is generally regarded as the first Union combat fatality of the Civil War, Pvt. Thornsbury Bailey Brown was shot and killed by a Confederate soldier at Fetterman Bridge in present-day West Virginia.

1960 - An earthquake of magnitude 9.5, the strongest ever measured, struck southern Chile, claiming some 1,655 lives.

TN Boy, 10, Dies After Severe Brain Injury After Near Drowning



10-year-old Asher Sullivan, who was swept into a storm drain by flood waters about a week and a half ago, has officially passed away. His father Dr. Jimmy Sullivan, head of Rutherford County

schools, said he and his wife over the last couple of days have been talking to doctors about a decision no parent wants to make, after being told that their son's brain function would not recover. While they were away meeting with neurologists about the latest MRI, Asher's vitals crashed. After hours of testing, it was confirmed he had passed away. Asher remains on life support at Vanderbilt to be an organ donor. Dr. Sullivan said it is "100 percent an 'Asher' type of thing to

do in continuing to be selfless." An honor walk is being planned at Vanderbilt so that Asher can be celebrated as a hero, saving others' lives as an organ donor
