Registration Open for Co-Ed Adult Softball

The City of Athens Parks and Recreation Department has announced registration is now open for the Friendly City Co-Ed Adult Softball League for team registration and free agents, for individuals 16 and older, now through June 20th. The cost is \$400 per team and \$30 per free agent. Games will be played on Tuesdays, at 6:30 and 8:00 p.m., from June 25th to August 13th, at Athens Regional Park.
