

Soap Box Derby & MooFest




Tomorrow is when the official Soap Box Derby local preliminary races will take place here in Athens. This will determine who will represent the City of Athens in the World Championship races in Akron, Ohio in July. The local Stock and Super Stock winners will receive accommodations in the Akron area during race week. The local racing will be held at 200 Keith Lane in Athens. This is the first time the local derby will be held at

that location since the start of the construction project for the new Athens City Primary and Intermediate Schools. The first heat will begin at 8:15 a.m. The winners will be declared after two times down the hill facing a common opponent. The lowest accumulated time crossing the finish line will be the winner of that heat. The Awards Ceremony begins at 3 p.m. There is no admission charge to view the races. Limited seating is available, however you might want to bring your own lawn chair. Radio coverage will be presented on WYXI RADIO AM-1390 and FM-94.5. The radio coverage is being sponsored by A and J Body Shop, Athens Utilities Board, Athens Barn Center, Dooley Tractor Company, Domino's Pizza and Starr Convenient Care of Charleston. National MOOFEST will be in historic downtown Athens with over 180 Food, Craft & Info Vendors and the Athens Lions Club MooRun. There will be live entertainment on three stages, Mayfield Dairy contests, AgAvenue agriculture exhibits. Also inflatables, petting zoo, pony rides, and CASA dunking booths. Admission is free. Free Fishing Days



Tennessee's annual Free Fishing Days are approaching in early June. The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency hopes that access to free fishing will help get more people and their children into the activity. The Volunteer State always allows free fishing on the

first Saturday after the first Monday in June, which falls on June 8, 2024. On Free Fishing Day, anyone can fish in Tennessee's public waters and state parks without a license, even non-Tennessee residents. Private bodies of water may still charge for access. After Free Fishing Day, anglers under the age of 15 can fish for free for Free Wishing Week. Free Fishing Week for children runs from June 8 through June 14. A fishing license is required by the TWRA on any other date to fish. Fishing licenses can be purchased through the TWRA online starting at \$33 or at some outdoor sporting stores.

Large Naturalization Class in Chattanoga

More than 400 people became American citizens Wednesday morning at Memorial Auditorium in Chattanooga. There are 10 steps in the process of becoming a U.S. citizen. Those involve getting fingerprinted, interviewing with an immigration officer and taking English and civic tests plus several other requirements. Not everyone gets approved for citizenship the first time they apply. Study programs are available and the most popular use English as a second language (ESL) classes and adult education at TCAT schools across Tennessee, including the Tennessee College of Applied Technology here in Athens. While not very common, there are entire families that all become US citizens on the same day, which is quite a feat and usually comes with a large celebration afterwards. Lee Signs Two New Bills into Law



Governor Bill Lee has signed legislation preventing adults from assisting minors in obtaining abortions or receiving gender-affirming care without parental consent. These

laws, effective July 1, are expected to face legal challenges. Lee, known for restricting gender-affirming care and supporting Tennessee's near-total abortion ban, signed the bills without comment.

The new law makes Tennessee the second state to criminalize adults who "intentionally recruit, harbor, or transport" a pregnant minor for an abortion without parental consent. Exemptions include ambulance drivers and emergency medical services. Violations are classified as a Class A misdemeanor, punishable by nearly one year in prison.
