Reneau most recently served as vice president for opera-

tions support at the TVA Nuclear Fleet Center in Chattanooga. He joined TVA in 2009 after serving in the U.S. Navy and has held various leadership roles, including senior manager positions in Systems and Design Engineering, site Engineering director, and director of Operations. In 2021, he became plant manager at the Sequoyah Nuclear Plant, where he obtained his senior reactor certification. Reneau holds a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from The Citadel and an executive MBA from the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. **Richard Roper "Dick" Mulliner Jr.**, 84, of Berryville AR, passed away on May 27. Dick was diagnosed with Parkinson's in 2019, Supranuclear Palsy in 2023, and B-Cell Lymphoma in 2024. **1833**— Andrew Jackson became the first U.S. president to ride in a railroad car.
