Safe and Public Rides Act Introduced in U.S. Senate

On Thursday, June 13, U.S. Senators Marsha Blackburn and Peter Welch introduced the Safe and Private Rides Act. This legislation aims to protect passenger privacy by mandating that transportation network companies (TNC's) such as Uber and Lyft must notify passengers if their driver has a video recording device in the car and must also allow passengers to opt out of rides with such drivers. With 51% of Americans aged 18 to 29 having used rideshare services and the industry's profits expected to reach \$54 billion annually by 2027, the need for privacy and safety measures is growing. Many rideshare drivers use dashcams to enhance their safety, but these devices can raise privacy concerns for passengers. *Story Continued on Page 4*

Boating License Requirement Reminder

The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency has issued a public reminder that boating classes are necessary to gain a boating license in Tennessee. Tennessee residents born after January 1, 1989, must present a TWRA-issued Boating Safety Education Certificate to prove they have passed the

TWRA Boating Safety exam in order to operate a boat with more than 8.5 horsepower. No other certificates are accepted to meet this requirement. The process involves acquiring study materials, studying, and passing an approved exam administered by the TWRA. Once the class is completed the certificate will be issued which must be kept by the boater whenever on the water. Boaters must also purchase and bring the Type 600 Boating Safety Exam Permit to testing locations and to classes. Certification is not needed if an adult (18 or older) is on board to take control of the vessel, but this adult must also have the certification if born after January 1, 1989. The TWRA will accept any NASBLA-approved boating safety certificate for any out-of-state boaters born after this date. More information is available at tm.gov/twra.


















There have been instances where drivers recorded and released passenger footage online, violating their privacy. While rideshare companies addressed these incidents, the proposed act would ensure passengers are informed and can choose whether to ride with a recording device present. The Safe and Private Rides Act specifically requires transportation network companies to:

- Notify passengers if a driver has a video recording device in
- Provide passengers the option to opt out of rides with recording devices.
- Grant the Federal Trade Commission the authority to enforce these transparency measures.

Today In History - June 17

1775 - The Battle of Bunker Hill took place in Boston in the American Revolutionary War. The actual battle took place on Breed's Hill, a short distance to the east of Bunker Hill.

1885 - The Statue of Liberty arrived in New York City aboard the French ship *İsere*.

1928 - Amelia Earhart embarked on the first trans -Atlantic flight by a woman, as a passenger. Pilot Wilmer Stultz and mechanic Louis Gordon operated the aircraft while Earhart kept the flight log. The flight took 20 hours and 40 minutes.

1940 - France asked Germany for terms of surrender in World War II.

1994 - After leading police on a chase through Southern California, O.J. Simpson was arrested and charged with the murders of his ex-wife, Nicole, and Ronald Goldman.
