#### Gov. Lee Requests Disaster Declaration from President Biden



Governor Bill Lee has requested a Major Disaster Declaration from President Joe Biden for counties affected by severe weather and tornadoes on May 8-9, 2024.

"Federal disaster assistance will bring much-needed eco-

nomic relief and resources to help our communities and fellow Tennesseans recover from the devastation of these storms," said Gov. Lee.

If granted, federal Individual Assistance would be available to multiple counties across Tennessee, including Hamilton and Polk counties. The Individual Assistance program offers aid for rental assistance, home repairs, and personal property replacement, up to \$42,500. The FEMA Public Assistance program reimburses jurisdictions and certain private, non-profit organizations for emergency work and uninsured infrastructure repairs as well as eligible costs of responding to the emergency.

Tennessee experienced several rounds of severe thunderstorms which resulted in ten confirmed tornadoes, large, damaging hail, widespread areas of damaging straight-line winds, and heavy rainfall of up to nine inches in a 24-hour period, which caused significant flash flooding and riverine flooding from May 8 to May 9, 2024. Agricultural and business losses are not covered by FEMA, and the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA) is coordinating with federal agencies for additional aid.

The concert will be held at Market Pavilion at 106 South Jackson Street in downtown Athens, Tennessee starting at 7:00 p.m. Concert goers are





### Man Arrested After Monroe Co. Shooting



Monroe County Sheriff Tommy Jones reported on Facebook that on the afternoon of Saturday, June 15, Monroe County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to a shooting in the 700 block of Seedtick Road in Philadelphia. Upon arrival, deputies discovered a female subject with a gun

shot wound. The female was transported to a hospital with serious injuries. A male subject was located nearby and taken into custody after deputies breached the residence. No names will be released at this time, as the investigation is ongoing. The agencies that assisted the Monroe County Sheriff's Office with the response and investigation of this incident included: Sweetwater and Madisonville Police Departments as well as
