New State DUI Laws Begin on July 1

Two new DUI laws will take effect in Tennessee on July 1. One law increases the severity of penalties for first-time offenders, while the other changes the location where offenders serve their sentences. The legal blood alcohol limit will be lowered from 0.2% to 0.15%, and the minimum jail time for first-time offenders will increase from 48 hours to seven days. This stricter penalty may result in more cases going to trial as defendants might plead not guilty more frequently. Additionally, the new law allows first-time DUI offenders, at the discretion of the judge and prosecutor, to serve their sentence in an alternative facility instead of jail. These alternative facilities will provide counseling and DUI classes, although offenders will still be confined.

- The Athens City Council met in regular session last evening. Major items on the agenda included: City Attorney Chris Caldwell presented the results of his investigation concerning several organizations in the City that have imposed a ban of Council Member Dick Pelley from participating in any future events at the Athens Area Chamber of Commerce, Tennessee Wesleyan University and the McMinn Senior Activity Center. The City Attorney also presented his investigation of Council Member Pelley who allegedly acted unilaterally to post flags at Veterans Park bypassing established protocols, violations of state law, the city charter and creating a potential liability to the city. A vote was taken and passed to hold a public meeting to review the charges against Pelley and to consider an ouster to remove him from office. The city also approved a \$130,000 purchase of a tract of land on Elizabeth Street for a proposed fire station #3. Also, the budget for the new fiscal year was passed on final reading.
- Today, June 19th, is now a national, state and local holiday. Its official name is Juneteenth and commemorates the day in 1865 when the last group of slaves were emancipated and given their freedom in the Galveston, Texas area. The Athens City Municipal Building will be closed as well as most financial institutions. The local chapter of the NAACP will hold a Juneteenth celebration of culture this Saturday, June 22nd from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at J.L. Cook Memorial Park at 414 Cook Drive here in Athens. The free event will have live music, food and dancers.
- The McMinn County Highway Department has announced that County Road 718, Nipper Road, will be closed on Thursday, June 20 and Monday June 24, from 8 am 4 pm for road construction.

TODAY IN HISTORY—June 19

1903 - Baseball player Lou Gehrig was born. He was a star first baseman and hitter for the New York Yankees. He played in 2,130 consecutive games. He died at the age of 37 from a rare and fatal form of paralysis, which has since come to be called "Lou Gehrig's Disease."

1914 - Bluegrass pioneer Lester Flatt was born. Along with banjo player Earl Scruggs, he had scores of hit records, including "Foggy Mountain Breakdown," "Cabin In the Hills," and "The Ballad of Jed Clampett."

1934 - Congress created the Federal Communications Commission to regulate interstate communications, including radio and television broadcasting. Among other things, the FCC assigns frequencies and issues licenses.

2000 - The Supreme Court, in a 6-3 ruling, barred officials from letting students lead stadium crowds in prayer before football games.
