



UT Men's Baseball Headed to World Series Finals

For the first time since 1951, Tennessee baseball is headed to the Men's College World Series (MCWS) championship series after defeating Florida State 7-2. This victory marks Tennessee's first 3-0 start in MCWS history and sets a new program record for wins in a season with 58. Pitcher Zander Sechrist delivered a strong performance, allowing only two runs on five hits over 6.1 innings. Blake Burke led the offense, going 3-for-5 with two RBIs and a home run, his 50th career homer and 20th of the season. This makes Tennessee the first NCAA Division I team with five players hitting 20 or more home runs in a season. Christian Moore and Billy Amick also had notable performances, each with two hits, two runs, and an RBI. Moore hit a key triple that extended Tennessee's lead. Relief pitchers Kirby Connell and Nate Snead contributed by allowing no runs and only one hit combined. Tennessee will face Texas A&M in the best-of-three MCWS Finals starting Saturday. Both teams went undefeated in the round-robin and both are coming off impressive wins with Texas A&M defeating Florida 6-0. Tennessee and Texas A&M did not meet during the regular season, but they did clash in the SEC tournament in late May, where Tennessee emerged victorious with a 7-4 win on their way to securing the tournament title. The best-of-three championship series kicks off Saturday. Here's the full schedule:

Today in History - June 21

1788 - The U.S. Constitution went into effect as New Hampshire became the ninth state to ratify it.

1893 - The first Ferris wheel (invented by George Washington Gale Ferris, Jr., a Pittsburgh-based engineer) made its debut, at the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago.

1945 - Japanese resistance on Okinawa was finally defeated less than three months after U.S. troops landed there as the last stepping-stone before the planned assault on Japan's main islands in World War II.

1965 - Gary Player, from South Africa, won the U.S. Open golf tournament to become only the fourth winner to earn all four top pro golf titles.

1982 - John Hinckley Jr. was found innocent by reason of insanity in the shootings of President Ronald Reagan and three others.

1997 - The Women's National Basketball Association made its debut with the New York Liberty defeating the Los Angeles Sparks in the league's first game.
