On Friday, June 21, it was formally announced to all persons interested that a called meeting of the Athens City Council will be held at the Athens Municipal Building in the Burkett Witt Council

Chambers located at 815 N. Jackson St. in Athens beginning at 4 pm tomorrow, Tuesday, June 25. The purpose of this meeting is for reconsideration of a motion approved at the June 18, 2024 City Council meeting concerning a Public Hearing regarding Council Member Pelley including revisions to or rescinding of the motion. This meeting will also include consideration of a motion to authorize the City Attorney to bring a suit for ouster against Council Member Pelley under <u>T.C.A. 8-47-101</u>.

McMinn County Awarded Site Development Grant

Tennessee Governor Bill Lee and Economic and Community Development Commissioner (TNECD) Stuart C. McWhorter announced 15 new Site Development Grant recipients, awarding over \$17 million to help communities improve infrastructure and land economic development projects. McMinn County, for example, will receive \$984,752 for an access road at Athens McMinn Innovation Park.

An advisory committee, including TNECD, Austin Consulting, the Tennessee Valley Authority, the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, and the Tennessee Department of Transportation, reviewed the applications. Each application also had support from local legislators.

The Site Development Grant program, part of the Rural Economic Opportunity Act, aims to enhance Tennessee's rural economies. Since 2016, it has awarded 180 grants totaling nearly \$100 million, creating 7,011 jobs. The Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce has secured nearly \$7 million in grants, used for industrial roads, studies, site expansion, and utility infrastructure.

What Day Is It?

Today In History - June 24

1541 - Spanish conquistador Francisco de Orellana, the first European to sail down Brazil's Amazon River, fought a famous battle with warrior women. The women were described as tall with long braided hair wound around their heads. They resembled the fighting women of ancient Greek legend, the Amazons, so much that the river where the battle took place has been called the Amazon ever since.

1895 - Heavyweight boxing champ Jack Demsey was born.

1947 - American businessman Kenneth Arnold saw a number of objects "flying like saucers" while piloting a small plane over Mount Rainier in Washington; it was considered the first modern sighting of UFOs and gave rise to the term flying saucer.

1948 - Russia blockaded the western zones of Berlin, obstructing all rail, water, and highway routes. This set the stage for the "Berlin Airlift," in which the Western allies flew in supplies to meet the needs of more than 2-million people in West Berlin.

1975 - An Eastern Airlines Boeing 727 crashed at New York's Kennedy International Airport, killing 114.
