UT Volunteers Win NCAA World Series



The mountain for every NCAA Men's Baseball team in the country to climb is now Rocky Top. Last night, Tennessee Baseball secured its first national championship in school history by defeating Texas A&M 6-5 in the winner-take-all game of the Men's College World Series. Christian Moore's leadoff home run in the bottom of the first inning gave Tennessee an early

lead. Despite Texas A&M's strong pitching staff, Tennessee's pitchers delivered a dominant performance throughout the game. Key plays in the seventh inning provided crucial insurance to fend off a late rally by the Aggies.

This victory also ended the "No. 1 overall seed curse," making Tennessee the first top-ranked team since Miami (FL) in 1999 to win the national championship. Tennessee, which began playing baseball in 1897, had previously reached the championship round in 1951 but lost to Oklahoma. The win also highlights the SEC's dominance, as the conference has now won five consecutive College World Series titles with five different schools since 2019.



TODAY IN HISTORY - June 25

1788 - The Virginia colony entered the United States of America as the tenth state.

1876 - Lt. Col. George A. Custer and his 7th Cavalry were wiped out by Sioux and Cheyenne Indians in the Battle of the Little Big Horn in Montana. The Army was attempting to round-up Indians and put them on reservations. One horse, Comanche, is said to be the sole survivor among Custer's forces.

1950 - North Korean forces invaded South Korea, starting the Korean War. After North Korea ignored a United Nations order to retreat, U.S. air and naval forces were sent to South Korea.

1903 - Author George Orwell was born. His novels included "1984" and "Animal Farm."

1951 - The first commercial color telecast took place as CBS transmitted a one-hour special from New York to four other cities. The CBS color system was not compatible with black & white TV's and was later rejected.

2009 - Michael Jackson died from an overdose of the powerful anesthetic propofol.
