### Flag Replaced at I-75 Memorial



Volunteers gathered on Monday afternoon at the American Legion memorial off I-75 at exit 49 in Athens to raise a new American flag just in time for the Fourth of July. The memorial was originally built in 2006. The flag measures 30-feetby-60-feet and waves about 150 feet off the ground. The memorial surrounding it also has smaller flags representing each branch of the military as well as the POW/MIA flag. ### TN Gas Prices on the Rise

Tennessee gas prices rose by 10 cents last week, reaching an average of \$3.10 per gallon, the same as a month ago and slightly higher than a year ago. Nationally, the average gas price increased by five cents to \$3.49 due to oil prices exceeding \$80 per barrel. The Energy Information Administration (EIA) reported a decrease in gas demand and an increase in gasoline stocks, which may help mitigate further price hikes. Additionally, U.S. crude oil inventories rose by 3.6 million barrels, now just 2% below the five-year average. *Graphic Provided by AAA - The Auto Club Group*
