Vehicular Incident in Etowah



A 2006 Volvo Tractor Trailer and a 2010 Ford Fusion collided around 1:30 pm on Friday afternoon on Tennessee Ave. at First Street in Etowah. Fire personnel removed the Fusion driver's door for easier removal of the driver, who was treated by AMR then transported to Starr Regional in Etowah. Another Dead at Blythe's Ferry, Meigs Co.

A Tennessee fisherman in his mid-70s died Friday morning in Meigs County after suffering a medical issue while on the water. The incident occurred at 9:30 AM near the confluence of the Hiwassee and Tennessee Rivers and the Blythe's Ferry boat ramp, according to the Tennes-



see Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA). The man, from Dyer County, Tennessee, was fishing with a friend when he experienced a medical emergency and fell into the water without wearing a lifejacket. His friend jumped in, pulled him back to the boat, called 911, and drove toward the Highway 58 boat ramp. First responders pronounced the man, who remains unidentified, dead at the scene. This marks the 11th water-related death in Tennessee in 2024. Earlier in February, two people drowned in the same area, prompting nearby counties to plan for collaborative responses to water accidents....Newschannel9.com





4th Annual Battle of Athens Festival



The Battle of Athens Festival Committee is thrilled to announce the 4th annual Battle of Athens Festival on Saturday, August 3, 2024, from 4:00 to 8:00 PM at Market Park in Athens. This year's festival continues to emphasize the historic aspects of the Battle, featuring more historical, cultural, and educational vendors. Food trucks

will be available, and misting fans will help keep attendees cool.

The festival will include displays with photos and information about the Battle, the individuals involved, and the issues of the campaign. Memorabilia, artifacts, primary source materials, and multiple perspectives on the Battle will be showcased. Descendants of Battle participants will speak, and a large HD television will screen video interviews and documentary material. Audio interviews and live broadcasts of the Battle will be played through a sound system. Attendees are invited to join a downtown walking tour of related sites.

New additions to the festival include a slideshow of photographs,

newspaper headlines, and letters to Congressman John Jennings from McMinn Countians seeking help with honest elections. Children's story time, featuring a new book about the Battle, will be hosted by E.G. Fisher and Etowah Carnegie Libraries. Festival t-shirts will be on sale, and there will be two door prize drawings. Thanks to new sponsors, this year's festival promises to be the best yet.

Festival activities will be organized into four hour-long blocks:

- 4:00 PM: Documentaries and Radio broadcasts
- 5:00 PM: Vendor showcase, children's storytime, slideshows, pop-up museum, and memorabilia/artifact displays

- 7:00 PM: Downtown Walking Tour and Documentaries



4th of July Victim Identified



From WATE.COM: The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency has identified a man whose body was recovered at Watts Bar Lake after he went overboard at Tennessee National Marina on Thursday.

James Doyle Frost, 75, of Knoxville, drowned while docking his boat at Tennessee National Marina the afternoon of July 4. TWRA said that witnesses said he fell overboard, went underwater, and did not resurface. Multiple agencies responded to search for him. His body was located by a TWRA investigator using a Remote Operated Vehicle (ROV) and members of the Loudon County Dive Rescue team made the recovery just after 9 p.m. Thursday.
