It's the All American Soap Box Derby Week



Since the final whistle was blown closing out the 29th annual Athens Soap Box Derby, winners Titus Millsaps, AnnieMaye Johnson and Breylin Hagerty have been preparing for the International Soap Box Derby in Akron, Ohio. The 86th annual FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby World Championships are being held this week with check-in having taken place on Sunday, July 14 and races concluding on Saturday, July 20. The Soap Box Derby is a youth-oriented gravity car racing program which has been running in the United States since 1934. This year, the first Athens champion to be crowned was Breylin Hagerty in the Super Kids Division. Super Kids are special needs children who race in two seat cars driven by experienced Derby drivers. Titus Millsaps won the Stock Division Championship winning 8 of 9 races, including 5 sudden death matchups on the way to the title. AnnieMaye Johnson won the Super Stock division racing drivers twice her size and age as an 8-year-old, the youngest and smallest in her division. Both Millsaps and Johnson are making return trips to Akron. Millsaps won in a

repeat of last year's race and Super Kids are allowed to return to race in the same division. Johnson moved up to Super Stocks after winning the Stock Division title in 2023. Trump Survives Assassination Attempt

Former President and presumptive Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump was only minutes into a rally speech in Pennsylvania when he was grazed by a gunshot that took him to the ground. The bullet came from a nearby rooftop and killed one spectator and left two others critically injured. A Secret Service sniper promptly shot and killed the assassin, since identified as 20-year-old Thomas Matthew Crooks, of Bethel Park, Pennsylvania. FBI officials have said that Crooks used an "AR-style rifle" that was legally purchased by the gunman's father. The FBI released a statement in which they believe the gunman acted alone. Before shots rang out, rally goers noticed the man climbing to the roof with a gun and warned local law enforcement. An officer climbed to the roof and confronted Crooks who pointed his rifle at the officer. The officer then retreated down the ladder and Crooks proceeded to quickly take a shot at the former President when he was then shot by Secret Service. As of the publishing of this article, no particular motive has been announced by officials. However, Crooks was confirmed to be a registered Republican voter in the Pennsylvania voter registration logs. The FBI says that the shooter's family is fully cooperating with their investigation. President Joe Biden on Sunday called for Americans to "unite as one nation" and vowed a "thorough and swift" investigation into the gunman's motives and an "independent review" of Secret Service security measures ahead of the Republican National Convention this week.

1606 - The Dutch painter Rembrandt was born. His best-known painting is called "The Night Watch.




