Team Tennessee at 2024 DYB World Series

Sweetwater's 10u and 12u baseball teams will represent Team Tennessee at the 2024 Diamond Youth Baseball (DYB) World Series, aiming to defend their 2023 titles. This year, the event holds extra significance due to the passing of teammate Ace Mason, who died in January 2024 at the age of eight. In honor of Ace, his name and number were prominently displayed on uniforms and memorabilia throughout the season and state tournament.

"Literally everywhere I turned I felt my creator and Ace," said Lacey Thompson, Ace's mother. "Ace on helmets, in pockets and photos in the dugout. Huddle breaks hearing 'Ace on three!' or '23 on 3!' I was a spectator to a team that gave every ounce of talent and heart they've been gifted."

"We are so excited to watch these young men participate in a once in a lifetime opportunity that they earned. The success of our team would not be possible without the support of our sponsors, community, and the sacrifices made by the families of the players," said Nicki Nile, President, Sweetwater Dixie Youth.

This year's DYB World Series tournament (formerly Dixie Youth Baseball) will be held in Bossier City, Louisiana beginning on July 24. Both teams will be defending their unprecedented 2023 world series titles.

1790 - Congress designated the District of Columbia as the permanent seat of the U.S. government.
