\$10,000 Reward for Info in State Forest Vandalism Case



A \$10,000 reward is now being offered by the Tennessee Department of Agriculture (TDA) for information leading to

the apprehension, arrest, and conviction of the person or persons responsible for vandalism and theft at Franklin State Forest.

"As investigators continue to collect evidence at the scene in Franklin County, we are asking for the public's help with information about the recent crimes," Commissioner Charlie Hatcher, D.V.M. said. "Early estimates of the \$1 million loss to forestry equipment leave taxpayers footing the bill."

Sometime during July 10-14, 2024, five TDA Division of Forestry dozers and one transport truck and trailer were vandalized and damaged, rendering the equipment inoperable.

The forest will remain closed to visitors while evidence is gathered. TDA will announce when law enforcement officers complete their investigation and the forest reopens.

New CEO at United Way of McMinn & Meigs Counties



Lee Montgomery has been named the new President and CEO of the United Way of McMinn & Meigs Counties, succeeding Paige Zabo, who has retired. Zabo took on the role of President and CEO in early 2020 and led the organization through the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. She spearheaded efforts to raise funds and provide emergency assistance, including rent and mortgage relief for those affected by the pandemic.

During her tenure, Zabo, a native of Meigs County and longtime resident of McMinn County, achieved record fundraising levels and launched an annual golf tournament. She also established an early childhood task force to address affordable childcare and the McMinn-Meigs Assist Program, offering rent, utility, and food assistance for those facing emergencies like illness or job loss.

Montgomery, who has a background in executive roles with the YMCA and manufacturing, has also served on the Board of Directors of United Way of McMinn & Meigs Counties and been a Campaign Co-Chair. Moses highlighted Montgomery's comprehensive experience with United Way, noting, "Lee has seen this operation from every possible angle."

A public reception to honor Zabo and welcome Montgomery will be held on Wednesday, July 31, 2024, from 3 to 5 p.m. in the Glenn Lowe Dining Room of the Sherman Fine Arts Building at Tennessee Wesleyan University.

86th Annual All-American Soap Box Derby Wrap-Up



The race week at the All-American Soap Box Derby wrapped up with the 86th running on Saturday, July 20th in Akron, Ohio. There were absolutely perfect racing conditions, with clear skies and temperatures around 80 degrees. Unfortunately, our Athens champions suffered some of the closest defeats of the entire competition with them losing by a combined five thousandths of a second.

In what was just the second race of the day, our local stock champion, Titus Millsaps did not have time to be nervous as he headed straight for the starting blocks. Competing in lane 3, Titus, defeated Anthony Cardenas of Fayetteville, NC by .087 seconds but fell to Cooper Eubank of Roanoke, VA by .002 seconds, knocking him out of the competition. After finishing 2nd in his heat by the narrowest of margins, Titus was still in great spirits, stating that he still had a great time and an awesome experience getting to spend all week in Akron with his parents and siblings as a champion.

Later in the morning, it was Anniemaye Johnson's turn to make her second consecutive trip down the hill at Derby Downs as she was now competing in the Super Stock division. To add to the drama of our Athens racers on Saturday, Anniemaye was part of the what ended up being one of the closest 3-driver heats of the day. Also positioned in lane 3, Annie defeated Makalla Dempsey of Columbus, Ohio by just .009 seconds but finished behind Cora Freidenstine of Liberty, New York (who was the eventual 5th place finisher) by .003 seconds. It is incredible to see one race finish this close, but both of the Athens drivers could not have been closer to advancing to Round 2. These are margins that are only noticeable by the automatic timing equipment as to the naked eye it may look like a dead tie and probably could have been decided by just the slightest movements of the steering handle. Annie also said she had a great time and felt so much more comfortable on the track and with the experience overall after being a participant last year as well.

I can attest after spending 6 days with them in Ohio that these kids are wonderful representations of our community and great ambassadors for the City of Athens. It was a privilege to see them grow with more confidence as the week progressed and they got more track time under their belts.

Breylin Hagerty was our Super Kid representative who competed in the National Super Kids Classic. They compete by riding along in a 2 seat vehicle driven by a veteran racer and are able to experience the same thrills as the other children. Unfortunately, Breylin was knocked out of the double elimination bracket but had an amazing time after getting to compete for his 2nd time overall, and watching his sis-
