### Driver Injured in Late-Night Crash on Hwy 307



A crash on Interstate 75 in Bradley County killed a 37year-old woman Sunday afternoon. The accident happened a little after 4 p.m. near the 28 mile marker, according to the Tennes-

see Highway Patrol. Their report says a 2003 Chevy Tahoe driven by Monica Thompson of Virginia was heading north when it drove off the roadway and onto the left shoulder. The THP says Thompson over-corrected and swerved to the right. Her vehicle then crossed both lanes of travel, ran off the road, struck a large tree and overturned. Thompson was later declared deceased.

Around 10 PM on Saturday, the driver of a 1999 Ford Explorer veered off the roadway on Hwy 307, colliding head-on with a tree. Although not trapped, the driver required assistance to exit the vehicle. They were treated by AMR and subsequently transported to Sweetwater Hospital.

Emergency response teams from Englewood Rural Fire, Niota Rural Fire, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Department were on the scene. The accident is under investigation by THP Sgt. Alex Barger.


# Obituaries

**1704** - The British captured Gibraltar, allowing them to freely travel in and out of the Mediterranean Sea.

**1783** - The Venezuelan general Simón Bolivar was born. He was known as "The Liberator" in much of South America, and he helped win independence for Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, and Venezuela.
