The McMinn Senior Activity Center announced that it has been selected as a recipient of the Walmart Community Grant program. This will enable the McMinn Senior Ac-



Two Men Steal from Cleveland Church

(Chattanoogan.com) Two men have been charged with stealing items from a Cleveland church. Deputies and detectives with the Bradley County Sheriff's Office responded to The Avenue Church, in reference to a burglary alarm. They discovered that the church had been broken into on at least two separate occasions during the previous two nights. Joshua Rutherford and Casey Rogers were identified as the suspects in these burglaries by detectives. On Wednesday a search warrant was obtained for a residence near the church. Numerous items from the church were located inside the residence. Rutherford was taken into custody at that residence and Rogers was taken into custody on Thursday in the same area. Rogers was charged with burglary and theft over \$2,500 and Rutherford was charged with two counts of burglary and theft over \$2,500.

LEO/SROs to Receive \$800 Retention Bonus

All eligible law enforcement officers and school resource officers (SROs) in Tennessee are going to get a little something extra in their paychecks this summer. A grant has made it possible for them to get an \$800 retention bonus, according to the Tennessee Department of Commerce & Insurance (TDCI) and the Tennessee Peace Officers Standards Training (POST) Commission. All those officers will get that bonus payment if they've completed their in-service hours for 2023 and are still employed as a law enforcement officer. SROs who have completed the 2023-2024 academic year and the proper amount of training will also be eligible, according to TDCI and POST.

Eligible officers already get an \$800 salary supplement payment from the POST Commission for completion of annual training requirements. This retention bonus is part of \$84 million invested in law enforcement by Tennessee Governor Bill Lee, with \$60 million dedicated to recruiting and retaining law enforcement officers and SROs, and \$24 million allocated to assisting agencies with the cost of training new officers.
