Three Members of The Nelons Family Gospel Group Dead in Wyoming Plane Crash



Three members of the gospel group The Nelons—Kelly Nelon Clark, her husband Jason Clark, and their daughter Amber Nelon Kistler—were killed in a plane crash near Recluse, Wyoming.

They were traveling to the Gaither Homecoming Cruise to Alaska. Also killed were Amber's husband Nathan Kistler, assistant Melodi Hodges, and the pilot Larry Haynie and his wife Melissa. The crash is under investigation, with initial reports suggesting an autopilot issue.

Kelly and Jason's other daughter, Autumn Nelon Streetman, was not on the plane and expressed gratitude for the support her family has received. Georgia Governor Brian Kemp and the Gospel Music Association (GMA) expressed condolences and remembered the contributions of the victims. The Nelons, inducted into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame in 2016, have a long and celebrated history in Southern Gospel music, with numerous awards and nominations.

City of Athens Traffic Notices

The City of Athens Public Works Department announces the following traffic notices:

Currently there is a yellow flashing caution light on Rocky Mount Road and a red flashing caution light on Dennis Street. Effective by the end of the day on WEDNESDAY, JULY 31, 2024 there will be STOP signs in place on eastbound and westbound Rocky Mount Road and northbound and southbound Dennis Street. The yellow flashing caution light on Rocky Mount Road will be placed on red flash. This will make the intersection a 4-WAY STOP.

Another intersection affected is HAMMERHILL ROAD AND TOWANDA TRAIL. Currently there is a STOP sign located on Towanda Trail. Effective by the end of the day on WEDNESDAY, JULY 31, 2024 there will be STOP signs in place on northbound and southbound Hammerhill Road. This will make the intersection a 3-WAY STOP.

\$300,000 in Grants to be Awarded to Charitable Organizations

Athens Federal nounced it will award at least \$300,000 to IRS-qualifying chari-

The Athens Federal Foundation has announced it will award at least \$300,000 to IRS-qualifying charitable organizations in 2024. Grant applications are available

online from August 1-15, 2024, and can be submitted via email. The Foundation supports non-profits in Bradley, McMinn, Meigs, Monroe, and Polk Counties, focusing on community development, affordable housing, job training, and programs for the economically disadvantaged. In 2023, it awarded \$272,300 to 33 organizations. The Foundation, established in 2009 with funds from Athens Bancshares Corporation, aims to grow its assets to support more local causes. 

One Injured in Dollywood Flash Floods on Sunday



Dollywood experienced significant flooding on Sunday due to an unusual and heavy rainstorm over Pigeon Forge. Despite the severity, the park was able to reopen by Monday after an efficient cleanup effort. According to Pete Owens, Dollywood's vice president of marketing, maintenance crews repaired a section of the parking lot and cleaned the entire park within 12 hours overnight.

The storm was described as a "100-year flood," an event for which the local infrastructure was not prepared.

Only one minor injury was reported, but emergency crews, including police and fire departments, were on hand to assist guests safely. Owens noted that Dollywood's emergency operations plan was activated in response to the flooding.

Today In History - July 30

1863 - Automaker Henry Ford was born near Dearborn, Michigan. He started the Ford Motor Company and unveiled his masterpiece, the Model T, in 1908. He also introduced the conveyer-belt assembly line method of making cars which revolutionized manufacturing.

1898 - Kellogg invented Corn Flakes.

1909 - The first airplane was delivered to the U.S. War Department.

1921 - Insulin was first isolated as a pancreatic extract by the Canadian scientists Sir Frederick G. Banting and Charles H. Best.

1930 - Uruguay defeated Argentina to win the first World Cup in football.

1945 - The USS Indianapolis was sunk by a Japanese submarine shortly after delivering the internal components of the atomic bombs that were later dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki; some 900 men died, many of whom succumbed to shark attacks, dehydration, and salt poisoning as they awaited rescue.

1965 - U.S. President Lyndon B. Johnson signed amendments to the Social Securities Act (1935) that established Medicare and Medicaid.
