### Two Charged in Meigs Co. Human Trafficking Case





Two people face felony human trafficking charges following a six-month investigation by special agents assigned to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation's Human Trafficking Unit.

Agents began investigating Tristin Epperson and Clarissa McKinney in early 2024, after receiving information concerning their interactions with a juvenile.

On Thursday, the Meigs County Grand Jury returned indictments, charging Epperson (DOB 4/19/1999) with one count of Commercial Sex Trafficking of a Minor, six counts of Statutory Rape, and one count of Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor. The grand jury returned indictments charging McKinney (DOB 7/30/1991) with one count of Commercial Sex Trafficking of a Minor, six counts of Facilitation of Stat-

utory Rape, and one count of Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor.

On Monday, authorities arrested and booked both into the Meigs County Jail. The court set Epperson's bond at \$100,000, while McKinney was released on her own recognizance.

The charges and allegations referenced in this release are merely accusations of criminal conduct and not evidence. The defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt and convicted through due process of law.

### DOJ Files Lawsuit Against Erlanger Hospital



The U.S. Department of Justice has filed a complaint against Erlanger Hospital, accusing the facility of illegally billing Medicare for services referred by its physicians from 2014 to at

least 2021. This complaint stems from a lawsuit initially filed by former Erlanger executives Alana Sullivan and Britt Tabor in April 2021, which was recently unsealed. They allege that Erlanger submitted false insurance claims through an illegal self-referral process, violating the federal anti-kickback statute known as the Stark Law. This law prohibits physicians from referring patients to entities with which they have a financial relationship unless an exception applies. The lawsuit asserts that Erlanger's claims were fraudulent because the patients were not eligible for reimbursement under these conditions.

For patients, this matter is significant because it suggests that decisions regarding their care may have been influenced by financial incentives rather than medical necessity. For example, one physician was reportedly rewarded with over \$1 million for generating more than \$9 million in hospital service fees through referrals, highlighting potential conflicts of interest.

The complaint details several actions by Erlanger, including employing more physicians to secure revenue, eliminating compensation oversight, and changing compensation models to attract physicians capable of generating substantial revenue. It alleges that Erlanger ignored fair market value assessments and overpaid certain physicians, disregarding warnings and concerns about overutilization and quality of care. These actions, according to the complaint, resulted in compensation to physicians that far exceeded the services provided, raising concerns about the prioritization of profit over patient care. ## Hamilton Co. Awards \$100,000 Settlement to Family of Woman Baptized by Deputy

A \$100,000 settlement has been reached in a lawsuit involving former deputy Daniel Wilkey, who was accused of baptizing Shandle Marie Riley in Lake Chickamauga after a traffic stop. The settlement, which is contingent on approval by the Hamilton County Commission, involves the county and Wilkey,

who faced multiple charges and lawsuits, some of which were dismissed or dropped.

The incident occurred in February 2019 when Wilkey stopped Riley, found a small amount of marijuana, and later suggested baptizing her, offering leniency in return. Wilkey and another officer, Jacob Goforth, carried out the baptism, which was filmed by Goforth.

Judge Travis McDonough dismissed some of Riley's claims but left others intact, including a claim against Goforth for failing to prevent a constitutional violation. Riley, who later passed away from unrelated causes, had filed the lawsuit alleging improper conduct and violations of her rights. Wilkey, previously indicted on 44 charges, has faced numerous legal challenges and still has a pending federal case related to an incident involving alleged excessive force in July 2019.

## Suspect Charged in Knoxville Home Robbery Investigation



The Knoxville Police Department announced that they have identified and charged 20-year-old Dwan Woodley in connection with a home robbery on Chester Avenue early Monday morning. Woodley faces multiple felony charges, including aggravated robbery, aggravated assault, and aggravated burglary. The incident occurred around 4 a.m. when two masked individuals broke into a 27-year-

old woman's home, with one suspect holding her at gunpoint. The suspects stole a PlayStation 5 and over \$3,000 in cash before fleeing in a white SUV.

Woodley, known to the victim, was later apprehended by KPD officers at a home on Blue Star Drive, where they also recovered the stolen items and a gun matching the description used in the robbery. The KPD has not provided additional information regarding the second suspect.
