ACS to Introduce TN's First All-Electric School Buses



Athens City Schools will be the first school system in Tennessee to receive five <u>Thomas Built Buses SAF-T-LINER® C2 Jouley</u>, the state's first all-electric school buses delivered under the EPA Clean School Bus Program. A celebration and ribbon-cutting ceremony will take place TODAY, Thursday, August 1st, from 10:30 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. at Athens City Intermediate School, located at 316 McMinn Avenue.

The introduction of these electric buses is part of a broader initiative funded by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, which provides \$5 billion over five years (FY 2022-2026) through the EPA's Clean School Bus Program to replace existing school buses with zero-emission and low-emission models. The first funding opportunity in 2022 allocated up to \$965 million to nearly 400 schools for bus replacements.

The SAF-T-LINER® C2 Jouley Electric School Bus offers significant advantages, including zero emissions at the tailpipe, no noise pollution, and freedom from fossil fuels, resulting in lower operating costs.

Key features of the C2 Jouley include:

- The lowest and most stable operating cost of any vehicle
- Two to three-hour charging time at a DC charging station
- Specialized battery packaging for enhanced safety
- Up to 149-mile operating range
- Built with up to 246 kWh power

The transition from diesel-fueled school buses to electric models is expected to significantly reduce emissions, making school transportation more sustainable and eco-friendly. Electric school buses are particularly well-suited for electrification due to their low daily mileage, predictable routes, health benefits for students and the community, and the potential for midday charging and providing power back to the grid during peak times.

Today is Election Day across Tennessee for local county races and state primaries. Several municipal elections are also on the ballot. Early voting concluded last Saturday, July 27th. Here in McMinn County, a total of 1,068 ballots were cast early, one of the lowest turn-outs in recent memory. The tally for early voting was 846 in the Republican Primary, 201 in the Democrat Primary and there were 21 ballots cast for Municipal elections in Etowah and Englewood. McMinn County has a total of 33,713 registered voters, according to TeAnna McKinney, McMinn County Election Commissioner. Polling hours today are 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Fiery Crash in Bradley County







Two people were taken to the hospital after a fiery crash in Bradley County Saturday evening. It happened on Spring Place Road near Million Drive. Bradley County EMS said a woman who was driving the vehicle swerved to avoid stopped traffic. The car flipped into a ditch and then caught fire. Authorities said the woman and man in the car were both wearing seat belts. The man was able to get out on his own. Bystanders pulled the woman away from the car before the car burst into flames. Today In History - August 1

1779 - Francis Scott Key was born. He was a lawyer who became famous for writing the lyrics for "The Star Spangled Banner." He wrote the words while watching the British fleet's bombardment of Fort McHenry in Baltimore Harbor during the War of 1812.

1874 - The insecticide DDT was first prepared. It was banned for use in the U.S. in 1972 due to concerns over its effect on our health and the environment.

1873 - Cable cars began operating in San Francisco. The cars are pulled by steel cables below the surface of the street.

1876 - Colorado was admitted as the 38th state. **1907** - The U.S. Army Signal Corps established an aeronautical division, the forerunner of the U.S. Air Force.

1936 - The Olympics opened in Berlin with a ceremony presided over by Adolf Hitler.

1977 - Pilot Francis Gary Powers was killed when his radio traffic helicopter crashed in Los Angeles. Powers gained fame when his U-2 spy plane was shot down over Russia in 1960.
