Niota Man Faces Additional Charges in Child Exploitation Case



Cody Shane Gunter, a resident of Niota, faces new charges of sexual exploitation of a minor following his arrest earlier this year during a Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) operation. Gunter was initially apprehended in April as part of 'Operation Protecting Tomorrow' and charged with Sexual Exploitation of a Minor and Solicitation of a Minor.

During the ongoing investigation, TBI special agents with the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) squad uncovered additional evidence linking Gunter to the production of child sexual abuse material. Last month, agents identified several victims, resulting in new arrest warrants. Gunter (DOB 03/18/1995) has now been charged with three counts of Especially Aggravated Sexual Exploitation of a Minor.

Authorities located Gunter in Cumberland County with the assistance of the Sheriffs' Offices of Rhea, Fentress, and Cumberland counties, as well as the Graysville and Crossville Police Departments. Gunter surrendered to the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department on Thursday and is currently being held without bond.

The charges and allegations referenced are merely accusations of criminal conduct and not evidence. The defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt and convicted through due process of law.

Monroe Co. Deputy Shoots, Kills Man

At the request of 10th Judicial District Attorney General Shari Tayloe, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) special agents are investigating a shooting involving a deputy from the Monroe County Sheriff's Department. The incident occurred Friday morning at approximately 8:30 at the Monroe County Justice Center, located in the 4500 block of New Highway 68.

Preliminary reports indicate that a man fired shots in the parking lot before approaching the building's front door, firing again, and entering the building. A deputy confronted the individual and discharged his service weapon, striking the man. The suspect was later pronounced dead at a local hospital. No other injuries were reported.

TBI agents are working to independently determine the sequence of events that led to the shooting, including gathering evidence and conducting interviews. The findings of the investigation will be shared with District Attorney General Tayloe for further review and consideration. The TBI's role in such cases is to act as fact-finders; they do not determine the justification of the officers' actions. That responsibility lies with the district attorney general who requested TBI's involvement.

The TBI does not release the identities of officers involved in such incidents, deferring instead to the respective department for such disclosures as they see fit.

The Athens Parks and Recreation Department has announced that anyone interested in having a brick placed in the Veterans Park walkway, in honor or in memory of a veteran, must place their order by 4:30 pm on August 14, 2024, to be included in the November 10, 2024, ceremony. In addition to a brick being placed in the walkway, brick purchasers receive an attractive certificate suitable for framing. in honor of their veteran. Veterans Park walkway bricks are \$50 each and the city also has replica bricks available for \$20 each. Replicas are 1 1/4" x 3" and are designed to take home as a souvenir as part of the ceremony. What Day is It?

Today in History - August 5

1884 - The cornerstone for the Statue of Liberty was laid at Bedloe's Island, now called Liberty Island, New York.

1914 - In Cleveland, Ohio, the first electric traffic light was installed; it featured red and green lights.

1926 - In his last public stunt, American magician Harry Houdini stayed in an underwater airtight coffin for approximately 90 minutes.

1962 - South African anti-apartheid activist Nelson Mandela was arrested on charges of leaving the country without a passport and inciting workers to strike; it was the beginning of 27 years of imprisonment.

the beginning of 27 years of imprisonment. **1967 -** The U.S. space probe Mariner 7 flew by Mars, sending back photographs and scientific data.

1981 - U.S. President Ronald Reagan fired more than 11,000 air traffic controllers who were on strike for better working conditions. While staffing levels were thought to be restored in two years, it took about 10 years before they returned to normal.

2010 - Thirty-three workers became trapped after a mine in the Atacama Desert of Chile collapsed, and the resulting rescue took 69 days, attracting international attention.
