# **Sunday Fire at Lee Manor Displaces Nine Families**



On August 4, 2024, around 7:00 p.m., the Athens Fire Department responded to a fire at Lee Manor Apartments, located at 1800 Lee Drive, after a neighbor reported seeing black smoke coming from apartment 79. Upon arrival, Battalion 1 established command, and firefighters observed flames along the roofline and heavy smoke from the building's front.

After confirming all occupants were safely evacuated, the fire crew entered the building and began suppression efforts. The fire was found to be on the Delta side of the building, spreading up the wall into the attic. Firefighters quickly contained the blaze to

apartments 78 and 79, with additional units arriving to support the initial responders. The Athens Utility Board disconnected water and electricity.

Apartment 79 suffered the most fire damage, while apartments 78 and 80 experienced smoke and heat damage. Firefighters conducted salvage and overhaul operations to prevent further spread, and fans were set up to clear smoke. The scene was secured, allowing tenants from nearby apartments to retrieve belongings.

In total, three apartments were damaged by the fire, and others sustained smoke and heat damage, displacing nine families. The fire originated on the first floor and spread to the attic. The two occupants of the burning apartment escaped without injury. The financial loss is currently undetermined, and the cause of the fire remains under investigation.

Chief Ainsworth stated, "Quick response and aggressive fire operations by our firefighters prevented the incident from becoming much worse." No injuries were reported. We would like to thank Athens Police for controlling the scene while our crews were occupied with the fire." AMR EMS was on scene for anyone needing triage or treatment.

### Vehicle and Victim Recovered from Lake Ocoee



LOCAL 3 NEWS: Polk County Sheriff Steve Ross says crews recovered a vehicle from Lake Ocoee Saturday afternoon. Authorities say there was one body inside. Earlier Friday afternoon, authorities responded to a tip say-

ing a car had hit a guardrail and plummeted into the lake below. The search for the vehicle began an investigation which continued on Saturday. The vehicle was very hard to find because rescue personnel had to determine where the car floated before it went completely underwater. A spokesman said that the vehicle could be anywhere within three square miles and the lake is over 100 feet deep in certain areas. The vehicle was eventually recovered on Saturday. The Tennessee Highway Patrol identified the deceased driver as 46-year-old Michele L. Lorino. The THP says that Lorino's 2019 Toyota Camry, traveling eastbound, went off the right side of US-64, where it hit a rock wall and guardrail which sent the vehicle airborne, causing it to land in the lake. *Photo Courtesy of <u>WTVC</u>* 


# **Obituaries**



# What Day Is It?

#### <u> Today In History - July 30</u>

 ${\bf 1806}$  - After a thousand years the Holy Roman Empire came to its official end, with the secession of its confederated states, when Emperor Francis II of Austria put down the imperial crown.

**1890** - The electric chair was used for the first time, to execute William Kemmler a convicted murderer at Auburn State Prison in New York.

**1926** - 19-year-old Gertrude Ederle of New York became the first American to swim the English Channel.

**1945** - An American bomber dropped the first atomic bomb used in warfare on the Japanese city of Hiroshima. Eight days later, after Nagasaki was also bombed, Japan surrendered, ending World War II. About 140,000 people died in the two bombings and the aftermath.

 ${\bf 1962}$  - Jamaica became an independent dominion within the Commonwealth of Nations.

**1965** - U.S. President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Voting Rights Act, which sought to overcome legal barriers at the state and local levels that prevented African Americans from exercising their right to vote; the legislation was weakened through several lawsuits in the 21st century.

**2012** - NASA's robotic vehicle Curiosity (also called Mars Science Laboratory) landed on Mars and soon began transmitting images of the planet's surface.
