

Johns Manville Union Seeks New Contract


Nearly four months after a historic vote to unionize Chattanooga's Volkswagen plant, another union in our area seeks success. Representatives from the Johns Manville union in Etowah met on Monday for negotiations. Their employees say they want a better work-life balance and better wages. Their contract is set to end Sunday at midnight. James Morrow, a United Steelworkers District 9 representative, says these workers also want their wages to reflect the rise of inflation throughout the area. Out of its 290 employees, 150 are currently union members. Johns Manville released a statement in response to the union's efforts: "We have been negotiating in good faith for three weeks. That time includes two contract extensions agreed to by both sides. Johns Manville provided the union with a competitive last, best and final offer on Sunday." From..... News Channel 9


Motorcyclist Dead after Hamilton Co. Crash



The Hamilton County Sheriff's Office is investigating a deadly crash involving a motorcyclist. It happened on Sunday. Deputies responded to reports of a pedestrian struck around 4:30 in the morning. HCSO says a woman was driving

south on Suck Creek Road when she saw a downed motorcycle in her lane. The woman says she swerved to avoid the bike and hit the motorcyclist who was lying in the road. The preliminary investigation shows the motorcyclist wrecked before the driver came across the scene. It's unclear how long he'd been in the road. At this time, investigators also don't know if the motorcyclist was dead before being hit by the car. The ID of the victim has not been released.

<u> Today in History - August 7</u>

1782 - The Order of the Purple Heart was established by George Washington to honor Americans wounded in the Revolutionary War.

1925 - Songwriter Felice Bryant was born. She and her husband, Boudleaux wrote dozens of hit songs, including most of the Everly Brothers' hits and the song, "Rocky Top." **1942** - U.S. Marines launched America's first offensive in the Pacific in World War II, as they landed on the island of Guadalcanal.

1948 - A new Olympic Games record was set when 83,000 spectators attended the final day of track and field events. The Games, held in London, England, had gate receipts to-taling more than \$2 million.

1971 - The Apollo 15 moon mission ended successfully as its command module splashed down in the Pacific Ocean.

1973 - Park ranger Roy Sullins was struck by lightning for the 5th time. As usual, he was not hurt.

2010 - Elena Kagan was sworn in as the 112th justice and fourth woman to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court.
