Here's an update on the massive fire that destroyed St. Mark AME Zion Church. Athens City Mayor, Steven Sherlin, says the church is a total loss. It took about six hours for firefighters to get the fire under control because it spread so fast. Mayor Sherlin says the outside rear of the church caught fire first. He also stated that one person died in the blaze. The name of the deceased has not been officially released, however, through several sources and social media, she was Linda Buchanan of Athens. Ms. Buchanan was a former Special Education teacher for the McMinn County Schools. The cause of the fire is still under investigation. Mayor Sherlin has confirmed that members of St. Mark Church have been in touch with the insurance company that covered the church and they do plan to rebuild.
