## **McMinn Correctional Officer Fired**



A McMinn County correctional officer is out of a job for jokingly using a stun gun on an inmate. Both the officer and the inmate said

they were "horsing around" Friday evening when the officer pulled out his stun gun and touched the inmate with it, according to Sheriff Joe Guy.

"It was both unprofessional and a violation of our use of force policy," Sheriff Guy said in a written statement.

He says the correctional officer was immediately fired once supervisors were made aware of the situation, but notes the officer did not act with malicious intent. The inmate was not hurt.

### TN Unemployment Holds Steady for Third Consecutive Month



Tennessee's unemployment rate remains at an all-time low of 3% for the third month in a row, according to the latest data from the Department of Labor and Workforce Development (TDLWD). This record low was first

achieved in May and has remained steady ever since.

Over the past year, the statewide unemployment rate has decreased by 0.2 percentage points, from 3.2% to 3%. Between June and July, employers in Tennessee added 2,000 nonfarm jobs, with the construction sector leading in job growth, followed by healthcare and social assistance, and wholesale trade.

In contrast, the national unemployment rate increased to 4.3% in July. Despite low unemployment, many Tennesseans are still searching for work, with state resources available to help job seekers and adults pursuing a high school equivalency diploma.

Despite the state's record-low unemployment, many Tennesseans are still seeking better employment opportunities. The TDLWD offers various free resources to job seekers, including online tools at <u>TNWorkReady.com</u>. Additionally, Tennesseans without a high school diploma can enhance their job prospects by enrolling in free Adult Education classes through TDLWD's <u>New</u> <u>Pathways to a Diploma</u> program.

## **TN Rolls Out New License, ID Design and Self-Service Kiosks**



This week, The Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security (TDOSHS) began issuing new Driver Licenses and ID cards with a fresh design and improved security features along with new self-service kiosks, which can reduce wait times at Driver Service

Centers. The new credentials and kiosks will expand to all Driver Service Centers over the next few months.

The new credentials are made with a sturdy poly-carbonate composition, incorporate cutting edge security and printing techniques. This includes elaborate overlapping of data and graphics and laser engraved elements that will show if the document has been altered or is fraudulent. A machine-readable barcode with applicable class, endorsements, and restrictions are printed on the back of the card. A mini ghost image repeated from the photograph is encoded elements for automated validation to help reduce identity theft.

There is no need for citizens to obtain a new Driver License or ID with the new design before their existing license or ID expires. Driver Licenses and ID cards with the old design will be in use alongside the new cards. Previously issued Driver Licenses are valid until the expiration date listed on the card. Individuals do not need to replace their current Driver License or ID card unless their current credential has reached its expiration or a required change is needed, such as a name or address change.

The new design will apply to all credentials issued by the TDOSHS including Regular Driver Licenses, Teen/Graduated Driver Licenses, CDLs, Motorcycle License, ID Only License, REAL IDs, and Handgun Carry Permits.

"We are excited about the added flexibility and convenience the new self-service kiosks will provide for Tennesseans," said TDOSHS Commissioner Long. "Citizens can complete many Driver Services transactions at one of these new kiosks which will help reduce wait times at Driver Services Centers."

Tennesseans can use the self-service kiosk to complete many Driver Services transactions including renewing or replacing a duplicate Driver License or ID Card, changing an address, updating emergency contact information, advancing a Teen/Graduated Driver License, paying reinstatement fees, and requesting a license reissue after reinstatement requirements are met. The new kiosks can take photos and process payments with Apple Pay, Google Pay, or a credit or debit card.

### Longest Zipline in the U.S. Coming to TN



The longest continuous zipline in the United States is coming to East Tennessee, adding a thrilling new attraction to the tourism hotbed of

Sevier County. WildSide, an outdoor adventure park in Pigeon Forge, announced that the massive zipline is set to open to the public in Spring of 2025. Dubbed the "Mega Zip at WildSide," it will extend 5,771 feet in length with a total vertical drop of more than 1,000 feet. Riders will take off from an elevation of 2,472 feet and descend to a height of 1,377 over the course of the ride. The park offers mountain biking, UTV tours, and e-biking across more than 18 total miles of trails. With a length of 5,523 feet, the Catamonster Zip at Catamount Mountain Resort in Hillsdale, New York currently holds the title of America's longest zipline.

#### **Over 100 Rabbits Rescued from Overwhelmed Caregiver in Chattanooga**

The Humane Society of the United States is assisting the McKamey Animal Center of Chattanooga in the rescue of over 100 rabbits from a nearby residence after an overwhelmed caregiver asked for help. The rabbits appeared to suffer from a variety of ailments including flea infestations, hair loss and injuries typical of overcrowding. Multiple nursing litters and rabbits of various ages were found burrowing in furniture throughout the residence. Veterinarians noted several rabbits may be pregnant. According to the owner, he has cared for pet rabbits for more than 30 years, but after enduring a health crisis, the population of rabbits grew out of control and beyond his capacity to provide the animals with ad-

equate care. He eventually reached out to the McKamey Animal Center, which requested the assistance of the Humane Society of the United States.
