City Council Files Petition to Remove Pelley



The City of Athens, Tennessee, has initiated legal proceedings to remove City Council Member Adolphus "Dick" Pelley from his position. The petition, filed by City Attorney Christopher M. Caldwell, alleges misconduct during Pelley's tenure, including violations of

his oath of office and city regulations.

The allegations center on Pelley's involvement in the Veteran's Park Project, where he is accused of bypassing official procedures, exerting undue control over the project, and exposing the city and its residents to potential risks and liabilities. Additionally, Pelley is alleged to have shared confidential city information with a private citizen over several years, leading to multiple lawsuits against the city.



City Council Files Petition to Remove Pelley (Cont.)



The court filing states: "(Pelley) while sitting as a City Councilmember has shared confidential information via e-mail over the course of some four plus years with a singular citizen of McMinn County, Tennessee. Specifically, Respondent has shared via "forwarding" nearly

two hundred or so e-mails with said individual. In addition, over thirty or more of said e-mails were "confidential" in nature and labeled as such..." "(Pelley)'s reckless disregard has provided said singular citizen with access to information that has led to multiple lawsuits against the City of Athens and its employees. (Pelley) 's acts have aided a singular citizen's agenda while costing the taxpayers... tens of thousands of dollars, or more, as the City of Athens has either paid directly or through increased insurance premiums for the defense of said lawsuits, most of which have been dismissed or have resulted in very little in the way of violations. Respondent's acts constitute both a violation of his oath of office and the municipal code as he clearly intended to benefit himself or the singular citizen from McMinn County through financial/monetary gain."

The petition requests Pelley's immediate suspension and eventual removal from office, pending a court hearing.

McMinn Athletics

John Peyton Frew, 91, of Cartersville, Georgia, passed away at his home on Friday, August, 23. He was born in Akron, Ohio, but moved with his family to Atlanta, Georgia, when he was 11. While he was a student at Decatur Boys High School, John started his part time broadcasting career at an Atlanta area radio station while also working part time at his dad's paint factory in Decatur, Georgia. John soon realized the paint factory wasn't his passion but working in radio was. He worked part time while in school at numerous locations throughout Georgia including Savannah, Valdosta, and Clarksville. He graduated from the University of Georgia in 1955 with a degree in Journalism and was a member of the Kappa Sigma fraternity. After graduation he joined the U.S. Army as a First Lieutenant and was stationed in Germany. After serving our country he was a full time newsman and Disc Jockey at WQXI in Atlanta, going by the radio name of "George T.

McEntyre." In 1966, John and his wife Julia, to whom he was married in 1961, built and operated WYXI Radio in Athens, Tennessee. After moving to Athens, Tennessee, John had been in the south long enough to know he liked having grits for breakfast and he found the local restaurant didn't have grits but the next week the restaurant served him grits for his breakfast. The family operated their Tennessee radio station until 1979, when they sold the radio station and moved back to Cartersville, which was Julia's hometown. John along with his wife Julia and daughter Julie purchased WYXC in Cartersville, operating it until 1999 when they sold the radio station and retired. He was preceded in death by his parents, Floyd William and Elizabeth Hobson Frew; His wife, Julia Neel Frew and his son-in-law, Johnny E. Massey. He is survived by his daughter: Julie Neel Frew-Massey; his granddaughter Juliet Laura Massey and his Maltese dog Ruby all of Cartersville.
