Sheriff Warns of McMinn Co. Phone Scam

McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy is alerting the public about a phone scam in which a caller, falsely identifying himself as "David Freeman with the McMinn County Sheriff's Office," demands payment of a "fine" to avoid jail time.

Sheriff Guy emphasized that there is no such officer employed by the department and that law enforcement agencies will never call individuals to request payment of fines.

Residents are urged to hang up immediately if they receive such a call and to contact their local police department or the sheriff's office to verify the legitimacy of the call, which is likely a scam.

Incident on Hwy 411 in Englewood



Around 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday, a 2022 Dodge Ram 3500 snagged a large communication cable on Highway 411 North at County Roads 508 and 516 in Englewood. The incident brought down two power poles and several high-voltage power

lines, sparking a fire that burned approximately one acre.

The accident led to the closure of Highway 411 for about three hours as crews from Athens Utilities Board (AUB) worked to restore the damaged poles and lines. Firefighters from Englewood Rural Fire and Etowah Rural Fire Departments responded to extinguish the fire.

Additional agencies involved included AMR, the Englewood Police Department, the McMinn County Sheriff's Department, and Tennessee Highway Patrol Trooper Logan Ballew, who is leading the investigation.


tickets include catered refreshments. Refreshments are available starting 30 minutes before show time.

Lee Awards Cleveland State GIVE Grant



Tennessee Gov. Bill Lee announced recipients of the Governor's Investment in Vocational Education (GIVE) grant program, which prioritizes learning opportunities in rural counties and enhances career and technical education statewide. This third round of GIVE grants will allocate \$41 million to foster regional partnerships between Tennessee Colleges of Applied Technology (TCATs), community colleges and local industries. Cleveland State Community College (CSCC) was awarded \$450,000 for their project titled: "ACT Now: Apprenticeships in Careers and Trades." Since creating GIVE, Gov. Lee's first legislative priority, has invested \$91.5 million into the program to support workforce development through technical education. The first and second rounds of GIVE funding in 2019 and 2021 served an estimated

15,500 students. The third round of GIVE grants will fund 23 projects statewide. The 23 funded projects will impact 47 counties, including 6 economically distressed and 13 at-risk counties. *Source: TN Governor's Office*
