### **Three Perish in Cleveland House Fire**

A house fire in Cleveland claimed the lives of three people on Sunday, according to Bradley County Fire and Rescue (BCFR). The fire occurred at a residence on Live Oak Trail. Benjamin Lawrence III, 75, was found dead at the scene, while Benjamin Lawrence Jr., 93, and Adrian Lawrence, 73, were transported to Bradley Medical Center and later to a burn center in Atlanta, where they succumbed to their injuries. Investigators from BCFR, the TBI, and the 10th Judicial District Attorney's Office are still working to determine the cause of the fire.

"Our thoughts and prayers are with the Lawrence family and all those impacted by this heartbreaking tragedy," said BCFR spokesman Adam Lewis. "We extend our deepest condolences during this difficult time." *From: Local 3 News*

#### New Knoxville Stadium Secures Naming Rights, Set to Open in 2025

Boyd, Randy owner of Boyd Sports, LLC, and Jim Vander-Steeg, President and CEO of Covenant Health. announced an agreement for the naming rights of the new stadiin East um

Knoxville. Branding for the stadium was unveiled last Wednesday. The stadium, which broke ground in June 2023 near the Old City, is a public-private project funded by the City of Knoxville, Knox County, and the State of Tennessee. Featuring 7,500 seats, the venue will create approximately 400 jobs and host Smokies baseball, One Knoxville SC, and other events. Expected to generate nearly half a billion dollars over 30 years, the stadium is slated for completion by March 25, 2025, with the Smokies' inaugural game scheduled for April 15 against the Chattanooga Lookouts. *Source: WATE.com*

### Today in History - August 28

**1781** - Los Angeles was founded by Spanish settlers.
