Monroe Co. Hazardous Waste Collection

The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) mobile household hazardous waste collection service will be in Hickman, Marshall, and <u>Monroe</u> counties on **Saturday**, **September 14**.

Tennesseans are encouraged to bring household hazardous waste – including cleaning fluids, pesticides, swimming pool chemicals and more – to a designated drop-off location. A person does not need to live in the county to participate. In Monroe County, the drop-off location is the Monroe County Highway Department, 3475 New Highway 68, Madisonville, from 8 a.m. –noon. The contact is Brandon West at (423) 442-2497.

Since 1993, more than 373,000 Tennessee households have safely disposed of over 24 million pounds of hazardous materials through more than 1,500 one-day collection events. Household hazardous waste, including items like cleaning fluids, pesticides, and batteries, should not be mixed with regular garbage due to their flammable, toxic, or corrosive nature. Collection events are free and no appointment is required, though businesses and other non-household sources must schedule an appointment and pay for disposal. Many local areas also offer collection for batteries, oil, paint, and electronic scrap (BOPAE). For more details, call 800-287-9013.

Rockwood Detective Arrested




