
#### West Valley Middle School Student Arrested After "Hit List"

A seventh-grade student at West Valley Middle School was arrested on Tuesday for posting an online threat, according to the Knox County Sheriff's Office (KCSO). Detectives determined that the student was one of several people responsible for an online threat listing multiple Knox County schools. The arrest took place around 4 p.m.

Sheriff Tom Spangler praised the efforts of the Juvenile Detectives Unit, led by Lieutenant Angela Parris, and thanked Knox County Schools and Tennessee Homeland Security for their assistance.

This incident is part of a growing number of school threats throughout the country. Earlier on Tuesday, Knox County District Attorney Charme Allen reported that 10 people are facing charges for similar threats, just one month into the school year. Last week, back-to-back threats at Halls High School prompted Sheriff Spangler to issue a warning to both students and parents.



#### McMinn County Senior Activity Center Hosting Golden Gala

The Center also offers crucial resources, including the Senior Safe at Home program, which provides financial assistance to seniors facing sudden economic hardship.

#### **Student Arrested (continued)**

"We have a small percentage of individuals who are making these threats," Spangler said Friday. "Parents, this is a notice to you as well. If you're having a problem with a child and you know about it but you're not letting [Knox County Sheriff's Office] know about it, we're going to come after you as well."

The threats, including a "hit list" naming six Knox County schools and others that have experienced school shootings, appeared on social media app Snapchat with the caption "Y'all Next."

This was accompanied by a post that said "Hey I'm becoming to be very known and hated which is one of the reasons I chose to do this torture to this earth. But September 11th knox County better be ready. I have some new equipment for you guys. And it's not just a gun." (Screenshot on Page 1)

The schools named included West Valley, Gresham, Bearden, Alcoa, Northwest, Farragut Middle Schools, and Farragut High School. While West Valley Middle informed parents that law enforcement found the threat to be unsubstantiated, Knox County Schools sent messages to parents on Tuesday, stating that KCS security and local law enforcement are investigating the situation further.

#### **Grand Re-Opening Celebration**

The Athens Parks and Recreation Department will be hosting a grand re-opening ceremony celebrating the completion of the renovated tennis and pickleball facility at the Ingleside Recreation Complex on Tuesday, September 17 th at 4:00pm.
