Blaze on Little Gudger Road



At 3:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Monroe County requested mutual aid for a structure fire on Little Gudger Road in Madisonville. Upon arrival, firefighters found the residence, garage, and several vehicles fully engulfed in flames. A neighbor reported nearly extin-

Suspect Arrested after Threats Made to Schools



At approximately 1:34 p.m. on Wednesday Sept. 11, the McMinn County Sheriff's Department and local school administrators were alerted by 911 dispatchers to a potential threat made by a suspect near Niota Elementary School. The suspect allegedly made a general threatening statement toward area schools.

In response, and out of an abundance of caution, the sheriff's office and school administrators placed Niota Elementary

in a "Hold" state, securing all students and staff inside the building. Although the threat was not specifically directed at Niota Elementary, the measure was taken to ensure safety. Deputies also contacted the local Homeland Security Agent and proceeded to the suspect's residence on County Road 255. "With 15 minutes of receiving the call, our deputies and the Homeland Security Agent had the suspect identified and in custody," said Sheriff Joe Guy. "It was also determined that he had made a threatening social media post as well."

According to School Security Director Justin Wallace, the "Hold" was lifted once the suspect was detained. "We are thankful for the quick response of our administrators and local law enforcement in prioritizing the safety of our school district." said Wallace.

Sheriff Joe Guy confirmed that 44-year-old Joshua Webb was taken into custody and transported to the McMinn County Jail. Webb faces felony charges of Making Threats of Mass Violence on School Property, a serious offense under Tennessee law.



Lopez Roque Arrested and in Custody

Here's an update on a story we had earlier this week: Dayren Lopez Roque, 41, is now in custody after being arrested by Texas authorities. The Cleveland Police Department confirmed in a release that they are working with Texas Rangers and local law enforcement agencies to bring him back to Tennessee. Lopez Roque will be facing First-Degree Murder charges in the death of 25-year-old Dayana Garcia. He was only 30 miles from the U.S. - Mexican border when he was arrested at a Family Dollar outside of La Pryor, Texas, according to the Zavala County Sheriff's Office. Last Sunday, officials responded to a call about a missing person. A search of an apartment found Dayana Garcia, 25, deceased. Investigators have deemed her death a domestic-related homicide. The department issued a First-Degree Murder warrant on Dayren Lopez Roque, a 41-year-old Hispanic male who was captured on Tuesday in Texas.

Former Teacher Sentenced after Secretly Recording Students



A former Tennessee teacher who admitted to secretly recording students in a locker room and taking inappropriate photos learned his sentence on Monday. According to court documents, 33-year-old Christopher Schroll pleaded guilty to attempted aggravated unlawful photography of a minor. Schroll was sentenced to four years, with five months to be served in jail and the remainder on supervised probation. Upon release, he will be required to wear an ankle monitor for 90 days.

The judge also issued a no-contact order, prohibiting Schroll from having any contact with the Cleveland school system, Champy's restaurant, the Mouse Creek Soccer Complex, and any of his victims. He is also barred from contacting any school system. Several families of the victims testified during Schroll's sentencing, sharing how his actions impacted their lives.

The case stemmed from an investigation in April 2022, when a detective discovered secret surveillance footage on Schroll's laptop. The videos included recordings of students changing in the locker room at Cleveland Middle School and footage taken up a student's skirt. Schroll admitted to installing the spy camera, which he purchased on Amazon, in the girls' locker room, claiming it was to address complaints of bullying and harassment. However, school administrators confirmed that Schroll never reported any such complaints to them. Families of the victims testified during the sentencing about the impact of his actions.
