Vols Run Through Golden Flashes



No. 9 Tennessee football shattered school scoring records with a dominant 71-0 victory over Kent State on Saturday night. The Vols (3-0) set modern-era records for points in a quarter (37), a half (65), a game (71), and total offense (740 yards). UT scored touchdowns on nine consecutive drives before settling for a field goal in the third quarter, outgaining Kent State 740-112 in total offense. Dylan Sampson led the charge with

four rushing touchdowns, just one shy of the school's single-game record, while quarterback Nico Iamaleava threw for 173 yards and a TD before exiting the game in the second quarter with the Vols up 51-0. Tennessee has now scored 50+ points in three straight games for the first time since 1913. The Vols continue their impressive non-conference streak, extending their winning run to 13 games. 




