TN Dept. of Health Tracking First Case of Measles Since 2019



The Tennessee Department of Health (TDH) has confirmed a single case of measles in a resident who recently


traveled internationally and spent time in Kentucky during the contagious period. The individual is now recovering. No additional measles cases have been identified in Tennessee, and further details are not available.

Measles spreads through the air when an infected person talks, coughs, or sneezes. Symptoms include fever, headache, and general discomfort, followed by a rash, cough, red eyes, or congestion. The red, spotty rash typically starts on the face and spreads to the rest of the body.

Measles is highly contagious and can be fatal, so suspected cases should be reported to TDH immediately at 615-741-7247. More information for the public and healthcare providers is available on the TDH website <u>HERE</u>. The last reported measles cases in Tennessee were in 2019.

Volkswagen Recalls EVERY ID.4

Volkswagen has issued a recall for all US-produced ID.4 electric vehicles due to a potential issue with the electric door-opening mechanism, which could cause doors to open unexpectedly. While no accidents or injuries have been reported, 135 warranty claims are linked to the problem. Water may enter the door handles and affect the internal circuit board, leading to door malfunctions. VW is working on a fix involving part replacement and a software update. Owners will be notified starting November 1, and VW advises those experiencing issues to contact their dealer immediately. This recall affects over 98,000 vehicles in the US and 20,600 in Canada. Source: Motor1.com
