#### TN Unemployment Sees Slight Increase



Tennessee's unemployment rate saw a slight rise last month after three consecutive months at record lows, according to the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development (TDLWD). The

seasonally adjusted rate for August was 3.1%, up from the 3% seen in May, June, and July. However, this is still an improvement from last year's 3.3%.

Total nonfarm employment dropped by 1,400 jobs from July to August, with the biggest losses in the mining, logging, construction, trade, transportation, utilities, and leisure sectors. Despite this, over the past year, 30,500 nonfarm jobs were added, primarily in education, health services, and trade.

Tennessee's unemployment rate remains below the national average of 4.2%, which dropped slightly from 4.3% in July. Job seekers can access resources through American Job Centers, which offer assistance like resume workshops and on-site recruiting. The next update on county-level unemployment data will be released on September 26, 2024. *Source: TN Dept. of Labor & Workforce Development.*





#### **Gas Prices Continue to Fall**



The national average price for a gallon of gas decreased slightly by two cents to \$3.22, slowing from recent drops due to Hurricane Francine's impact on Gulf Coast oil production. Gas demand rose slightly, while domestic gasoline stocks remained steady. Despite the demand increase, low oil costs are expected to keep prices falling. Meanwhile, the average cost for public EV charging remains unchanged at 35 cents per kilowatt. Gas prices are currently 19 cents lower than last month and 66 cents lower than the same time last year. The McMinn County Gas Price average is \$2.68/gallon.
