Person Killed After Train Crash in Monroe Co.

A tragic accident occurred in Vonore when a train collided with a vehicle at the Evans Street and Old Slag Road crossing, leaving one person dead. The incident took place at 7:56 a.m. on Friday, September 20, according to a statement from CSX. The train struck a vehicle, killing the driver, though no injuries were reported among the train crew.

The Tennessee Highway Patrol (THP) and Vonore Police Department responded to the scene. On Saturday, THP released a preliminary report identifying the victim as 44-year-old Bridgett Pearson. According to the report, Pearson failed to stop at the railroad crossbars and drove through the crossing, striking the train. Her vehicle slid down a gravel embankment as the train came to a stop on the tracks.

Vols Defeat Sooners On the Road



In a 25-15 victory, No. 6 Tennessee spoiled No. 15 Oklahoma's SEC debut with a strong defensive performance, overshadowing its typically high-powered offense. The Volunteers, who entered Week 4 as the nation's top-scoring team, managed only six points in the second half through a pair of field goals. However, their defense dominated, forcing three first-half turnovers

and holding the Sooners to -4 yards between the second and third quarters.

Oklahoma's offense found life in the second half after switching quarterbacks from Jackson Arnold to Michael Hawkins Jr. The change sparked a late rally, capped by a touchdown that brought the Sooners within striking distance. However, Tennessee's defense stepped up again, stopping Hawkins on a critical 2-point conversion attempt. Linebacker Arion Carter tackled the quarterback behind the line, effectively sealing the win for the Vols.

Tennessee then recovered the onside kick and ran out the clock, thanks to a crucial 16-yard rush from quarterback Nico Iamaleava on third-and-2. The victory marked Tennessee's first road win against a top-15 opponent since 2006.
