McMinn Co Student Charged in Posting Threat to McMinn Co High School

A 15 year-old female McMinn High student has been charged with making a threatening social media post last week.

According to Sheriff Joe Guy, officers and school officials responded last Thursday to McMinn High after the post was shared just before school. Officials say the post alarmed many students, staff and parents, and disrupted most of the school day. Sheriff Guy says a week-long investigation by his School Resource Officers has revealed the identity of the student as well as the reason behind the post.

"To put it simply: She admitted she just wanted to cause a stir so she wouldn't have to go to school that day" said Sheriff Guy. "The cost in manpower to taxpayers in our response that day can't be compared to the cost in anxiety and fear that this student caused and her irresponsible action has resulted in her being charged with a felony."

The charge of Making Threats of Mass Violence on School Property is now a felony in Tennessee. Sheriff Guy wishes students would think before they make a social media post. A felony charge can follow you the rest of your life," added Sheriff Guy. "Parents need to monitor student's social media, and encourage responsibility. Words matter, especially those directed at a school or another person in a threatening manner. We, along with our school administrators, will investigate, use our own technology, and prosecute these cases."


