#### **Electricity Rates on the Rise - AUB Blames TVA**



On August 22, the TVA Board of Directors approved a 5.25 percent base rate increase to fund ongoing construction and energy development. AUB will pass this TVA increase onto their ratepayers effective October 1. AUB claims to not be raising our

local rate, but are simply passing along on the increase to the customer. The final result will, however, be the same. The rate move will raise the monthly power bill of a typical household using 1,200 kilowatt hours of energy by about \$4.35. AUB General Manager, Eric Newberry, stated that staff have worked to keep AUB on "solid financial footing" but claims to not be able to "control TVA and their...power increases." September will see AUB rates have a slight decrease as "transition rates" take effect and replace the summer rate. Transition rates are the lowest of the year, with a base of \$0.08009 per kilowatt hour. The fuel charge for October will decrease from \$0.02211 in September to \$0.01958 per kilowatt hour.

"This is normally a time where ratepayers see some of the lowest rates of the year, however, with the recent 5.25% rate increase by TVA, rates will stay close the same as they were in the summer," stated AUB's Amy McDonald.



#### **Mother Son Dance Tickets on Sale Oct. 1**




