

Gas Prices Continue to Drop



Despite storm-related challenges and geopolitical tensions, the national average for a gallon of gas has dropped by three cents to \$3.19, according to AAA. Hurricane Helene's destruction re-

duced demand in affected areas by damaging infrastructure and causing power outages, but gasoline supply remained stable. Meanwhile, overseas tensions between Iran and Israel have raised concerns about oil shipments, pushing oil prices higher.

Gas demand in the U.S. dropped significantly, from 9.20 million barrels per day to 8.52, while domestic gasoline stocks slightly rose. With low demand and stable oil costs, gas prices are expected to continue their downward trend. The current national average is 60 cents lower than a year ago.

The average cost of public electric vehicle (EV) charging remains steady at 35 cents per kilowatt-hour.

Obituaries



Today in History

1535 - The first printing of the entire Bible in English was completed.

1822 - President Rutherford B. Hayes was born in Ohio. He reportedly enjoyed books more than politics. After being nominated for Congress, he refused to take time out from fighting in the Civil War to campaign.

1957 - One of the best-loved family TV programs--"Leave It To Beaver"--premiered on CBS on this date, starring Jerry Mathers as The Beaver.

1957 - The Space Age began as the Soviet Union launched Sputnik, the first man-made satellite, into orbit.

1958 - The first trans-Atlantic passenger jetliner service was begun by British Overseas Airways Corp. with flights between London and New York.

1990 - German lawmakers held the first meeting of the reunified country's parliament in the Reichstag in Berlin.

2002 - Richard Reid pleaded guilty in a federal court to trying to blow up a trans-Atlantic flight with explosives hidden in his shoes.

2021 A global outage of Facebook and its apps, including Instagram and WhatsApp, lasted six hours

2023 - 21 people were killed after a bus crashed off a bridge and plunged 15m (50ft) at Mestre, which is near Venice in Italy.
