

Full Circle Medical Center Receives TN Strong Families Grant

This three -year grant, established by Governor Bill Lee, aims to boost critical resources for expectant mothers by supporting local nonprofits across the state. As one of several organizations chosen from across the state to receive a portion of the \$20 million grant, Full Circle will significantly enhance its ability to provide comprehensive support to women and families facing unplanned or challenging pregnancies.

"We are deeply honored to have been selected as a recipient of the Tennessee Strong Families Grant," said Stephanie Muñoz, Executive Director. "This funding will allow us to expand our services and provide critically needed support to the women and families of East Tennessee over the next three years. - Larger baby care items such as nursery furniture, car seats, and strollers, in addition to the diapers, wipes, and formula already provided through donor support

- Rental assistance and rapid relocation for families facing housing insecurity

- Emergency bill pay services to help families maintain financial stability

- Car repair assistance to ensure reliable transportation for work and medical appointments

Razorbacks Upset Vols in Arkansas Win



The Arkansas Razorbacks (4-2, 2-1 SEC) rallied from a 14-3 third-quarter deficit to secure a 19-14 victory over top-ranked Tennessee, marking their first win against an AP top-5 team since 2007 when defeating No. 1 LSU. The victory also ended an 18-game losing streak against such

teams. Backup quarterback Singleton stepped up after starter Taylen Green left with an injury, leading the game-winning drive with a touch-down and key runs.

Arkansas fans stormed the field after the thrilling finish, but the celebration cost the school a \$250,000 SEC fine. This marks the first home win over a top-5 opponent since 1999.

Tennessee's Dylan Sampson rushed for two third-quarter touchdowns, but Arkansas responded with 16 unanswered points to seal the game. The Razorbacks' defense stopped Tennessee's final drive as time expired. Quarterback Green threw for 266 yards before his injury, while Singleton completed 2 of 3 passes for 31 yards and the go-ahead touchdown.

Tennessee, now 4-1, is expected to drop in the upcoming AP poll, before coming home to Neyland Stadium for their next game against Florida while Arkansas heads into a bye week with momentum ahead of their matchup with No. 13 LSU. *Photo Credit: Vols Wire*




Pumpkintown Offers Great Family Fun This Saturday
